compensate local governmental entities for the net amount of property tax revenues lost as a result of the homestead exemption, and specifying that said compensation shall constitute a voter-approved revenue change and shall not be included in state or local government fiscal year spending or subject to any statutory limitation on general fund appropriations.

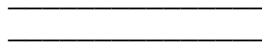
