# **PREAMENDED**

### A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE COLORADO PEACE OFFICERS STANDARDS AND TRAINING 102 BOARD.

## **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not necessarily reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted.)

Expands the definition of "peace officer, level Ia" to include the peace officers standards and training (P.O.S.T.) board staff director and investigators. Reduces the out-of-service window from 10 to 7 years for purposes of determining whether a certification may be renewed. Allows the P.O.S.T. board to permit out-of-state peace officers and federal agents to participate in the provisional certificate process so long as they have been certified in the other jurisdiction for at least the preceding 3 years and have served in good standing for more than one year. Enables the P.O.S.T. board to recognize out-of-state peace officers who work in Colorado through the mutual aid process. Provides that agreements between Colorado counties and municipalities and bordering states' counties and municipalities include a requirement that any person assigned to duty in Colorado pursuant to such agreement apply to the P.O.S.T. board for recognition.

6	P.O.S.T. board is authorized to grant a provisional certificate to any
7	person who:
8	(a) Is currently HAS BEEN authorized to act as a peace officer in
9	another state or federal jurisdiction, excluding the armed forces, FOR AT
10	LEAST THE PRECEDING THREE YEARS AND HAS SERVED AS A CERTIFIED LAW
11	ENFORCEMENT OFFICER IN GOOD STANDING IN SUCH OTHER STATE OR
12	FEDERAL JURISDICTION FOR MORE THAN ONE YEAR;
13	(2) The P.O.S.T. board is authorized to grant a basic certification
14	to a person who MEETS THE CRITERIA ESTABLISHED FOR BASIC
15	CERTIFICATION BY RULE OF THE P.O.S.T. BOARD.
16	(a) Holds a valid provisional certificate; and
17	(b) (I) Successfully completed approved training in each skills
18	area;
19	(II) Passes a skills examination in each area;
20	(III) Demonstrates to the P.O.S.T. board that he or she has met
21	comparable standards in each skills area in another state or federal

23	(IV) Demonstrates to the P.O.S.T. board proficiency in each skills

26	SECTION 4 29-1-206 Colorado Revised Statutes is amended

to read:

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2 **29-1-206.** Law enforcement agreements. Any county in this 3 state which THAT shares a common border with a county in another state, 4 AND ANY MUNICIPALITY LOCATED IN SUCH A BORDERING COUNTY OF THIS 5 STATE, may enter into an agreement with such THE bordering county OF 6 THE OTHER STATE OR WITH A MUNICIPALITY LOCATED IN THE BORDERING 7 COUNTY OF THE OTHER STATE to provide for reciprocal law enforcement 8 between such counties ENTITIES. Such agreement shall meet the 9 requirements of section 29-1-203 and shall include, but shall not be 10 limited to, an additional requirement that any person who is assigned to 11 law enforcement duty in this state pursuant to such intergovernmental 12 agreement and section 29-5-104 (2) shall be certified as a peace officer 13 in Colorado as provided for in section 24-31-305, C.R.S., THE OTHER 14 STATE AND SHALL APPLY TO THE PEACE OFFICER STANDARDS AND 15 TRAINING BOARD FOR RECOGNITION prior to such assignment.

**SECTION 5.** 29-5-104 (2), Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

**29-5-104.** Request for temporary assignment of police officers or deputy sheriffs - authority. (2) Where, under the provisions of section 29-1-206, a county OR MUNICIPALITY in this state enters into an intergovernmental agreement for reciprocal law enforcement with a bordering county OR WITH AMUNICIPALITY WITHIN A BORDERING COUNTY which THAT is located in another state, the sheriff LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY HEAD of either county OR MUNICIPALITY may, pursuant to the provisions of such intergovernmental agreement, request the sheriff LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY HEAD of the other county OR MUNICIPALITY to

assign deputy sheriffs or other peace officers to perform law enforcement duties within the jurisdiction of such requesting sheriff LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY HEAD and under such terms and conditions as are stated in the intergovernmental agreement. Prior to such assignment, such deputy sheriffs or other peace officers shall obtain certification RECOGNITION as peace officers in this state as provided for in section 24-31-305, 29-1-206, C.R.S. Such deputy sheriffs or other peace officers shall, while so assigned and performing duties subject to the direction and control of the requesting sheriff LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY HEAD, have the same power within the jurisdiction of the requesting sheriff LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY HEAD.

SECTION 6. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
