HB01-1198 by Representative(s) Dean; also Senator(s) Dyer (Durango)--Concerning the circulation of a petition in connection with an election, and, in connection therewith, making it unlawful for a person to employ another person to circulate a petition on either a paid or volunteer basis without knowing or reasonably believing that the circulator is legally qualified to vote in a political subdivision in which the petition is being circulated, eliminating the requirements that certain petition circulators be registered electors and that the identifying badge worn by a circulator of a statewide initiative and referendum petition list the name of the circulator, and modifying the information that must be provided in reports on the payment of statewide initiative and referendum petition circulators.

The question being "Shall the bill pass?".

A roll call vote was taken. As shown by the following recorded vote, a majority of those elected to the House voted in the affirmative and the bill was declared **passed**.
