Therefore, this bill becomes state 12 13 law at 12:01 am on April 6. This letter sets forth my reasoning for letting 14 the bill become law without my signature. 15 16 As you know, HB 01-1007 requires state agencies and regional councils to report their collaborative efforts to the Transportation Legislative 17 18 Review Committee. I am in favor of sharing information between agencies, particularly when dealing with transportation matters. Under 19 20 my administration, the Colorado Department of Transportation and the 21 Regional Transportation District have worked in conjunction on transit 22 issues, particularly the southwest corridor and the southeast corridor 23 projects. 24 25 There is no doubt that cooperation is required to ensure that conflicting or overlapping transit systems do not compete for precious funding 26 27 dollars. The Colorado Department of Transportation, under Colorado 28 law, is the lead agency on all transportation matters in the state.
