 Compensation for Members of the Board of Directors of the Regional 54 Transportation District to Twelve Thousand Dollars per Anum," which 55 I vetoed today at 11:30 am. This letter sets forth my reasons for vetoing 56 the bill.

As you know, HB 1073 increases pay for the members of the Board of 1 Directors of the Regional Transportation District from \$3,000 per year to 2 3 \$12,000 per year. I have in the past signed responsible pay raises for 4 public servants, and may do so in the future. 5 The pay raise in this case, however, is not responsible. This bill increases 6 7 the salary of the RTD Board of Directors by 400%. In comparison, the 8 members of the Colorado Transportation Commission are generally paid 9 only \$150 per month, plus expenses. 10 11 Such a large pay increase to a part-time governmental organization is not 12 appropriate.
