 54 FURTHER FINDS THAT IT IS NECESSARY TO MAKE ILLEGAL THE POSSESSION  
 55 OF SUCH NONPRESCRIPTION DRUGS WITH THE INTENT TO USE THE PRODUCT  
 56 AS AN IMMEDIATE PRECURSOR TO ANY CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE.



1 (2) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF LAW TO THE  
2 CONTRARY, NO PERSON SHALL POSSESS EPHEDRINE, PSEUDOEPHEDRINE, OR  
3 PHENYLPROPANOLAMINE OR THEIR SALTS, ISOMERS, OR SALTS OF ISOMERS  
4 WITH THE INTENT TO USE THE PRODUCT AS AN IMMEDIATE PRECURSOR TO
