is an important function for state government, however, S.B. 01-219 restrains the operation 55 of such entities too severely.

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The new rules passed in S.B. 01-219 state that one must be a resident of the state of Colorado 58 in order to qualify as a bail bonding agent and that those agents may not pay, as 59 subcontractors, those that do not also have a bail bonding license.

While I support the stated rationale for these measures – limiting corruption – I believe that 62 less invasive measures could be taken to complete the same goals. Restricting the ability of 63 national companies to operate in Colorado and limiting whom those companies may hire is 64 counter to the principles of reducing governmental regulations and allowing the free market 65 to operate.

In response to concerns about Correctional Officers and State Patrol Officers working for bail 68 bonding agents in their off-time, I am instructing the Executive Directors of the Department 69 of Public Safety and the Department of Corrections to institute rules banning such off-time 70 work.

Accordingly, I have vetoed this bill.		1

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTIONS

SCR01-002

By Senators Gordon, Anderson, Dyer (Durango), Hernandez, and Perlmutter; also Representative Hefley--Concerning the submission to the registered electors of the state of Colorado of an amendment to the constitution of the state of Colorado, exempting district attorneys from constitutional term limits.

Be It Resolved by the Senate of the Sixty-third General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the House of Representatives concurring herein:

SECTION 1. At the next election at which such question may be submitted, there shall be submitted to the registered electors of the state of Colorado, for their approval or rejection, the following amendment to the constitution of the state of Colorado, to wit:

Section 11 (1) of article XVIII of the constitution of the state of Colorado is amended to read:

Section 11. Elected government officials - limitation on terms.

(1) In order to broaden the opportunities for public service and to assure that elected officials of governments are responsive to the citizens of those governments, no nonjudicial elected official of any county, city and county, city, town, school district, service authority, or any other political subdivision of the State of Colorado, no member of the state board of education, and no elected member of the governing board of a state institution of higher education shall serve more than two consecutive terms in office, except that with respect to terms of office which are two years or shorter in duration, no such elected official shall serve more than three consecutive terms in office; EXCEPT THAT THIS SECTION SHALL NOT APPLY TO ELECTED DISTRICT ATTORNEYS. This limitation on the number of terms shall apply to terms of office beginning on or after January 1, 1995. For purposes of this Section 11, terms are considered consecutive unless they are at least four years apart.

Section 13 of article VI of the constitution of the state of Colorado is amended to read:

Section 13. District attorneys - election - term - salary - qualifications. In each judicial district there shall be a district attorney elected by the electors thereof, whose term of office shall be four years. District attorneys shall receive such salaries and perform such duties as provided by law. No person shall be eligible to the office of district attorney who shall not, at the time of his OR HER election, possess all the qualifications of district court judges as provided in this article. All district attorneys holding office on the effective date of this amendment shall continue in office for the remainder of the respective terms for which they were elected or appointed. ELECTED DISTRICT ATTORNEYS

SHALL NOT BE SUBJECT TO THE TERM LIMITS ENUMERATED IN SECTION 11 OF ARTICLE XVIII OF THIS CONSTITUTION.

SECTION 1. At the next election at which such question may be submitted, there shall be submitted to the registered electors of the state of Colorado, for their approval or rejection, the following amendment to the constitution of the state of Colorado, to wit:

Article XIV of the constitution of the state of Colorado is amended BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION to read:

Section 8.7. Coroner - qualifications. THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY SHALL HAVE THE AUTHORITY TO ESTABLISH BY LAW QUALIFICATIONS FOR THE OFFICE OF COUNTY CORONER, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO TRAINING AND CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS.

SECTION 2. Each elector voting at said election and desirous of voting for or against said amendment shall cast a vote as provided by law either "Yes" or "No" on the proposition: "AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE XIV OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF COLORADO, AUTHORIZING THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO ESTABLISH QUALIFICATIONS FOR THE OFFICE OF COUNTY CORONER."

SECTION 3. The votes cast for the adoption or rejection of said amendment shall be canvassed and the result determined in the manner provided by law for the canvassing of votes for representatives in Congress, and if a majority of the electors voting on the question shall have voted "Yes", the said amendment shall become a part of the state constitution.
