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## REPORTS OF COMMITTEES OF REFERENCE

### APPROPRIATIONS

After consideration on the merits, the Committee recommends the following:

**HB01-1018** be referred to the Committee of the Whole with favorable recommendation.

**HB01-1206** be postponed indefinitely.

**HB01-1331** be amended as follows, and as so amended, be referred to the Committee of the Whole with favorable recommendation:

Amend printed bill, page 14, after line 16, insert the following:

**"SECTION 14. Adjustment to the 2001 long bill.** (1) For the implementation of this act, appropriations made in the annual general appropriation act for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, shall be adjusted as follows:

(a) The appropriation to the department of health care policy and financing, indigent care program, children's basic health plan administration, is decreased by eighteen thousand seven hundred fifty dollars (\$18,750). Of said sum, six thousand five hundred sixty-two dollars (\$6,562) shall be from cash funds exempt from the children's basic health plan trust. In addition, the general assembly anticipates that twelve thousand one hundred eighty-eight dollars (\$12,188) from federal funds will not be received for this purpose. Although such federal funds are not appropriated, the associated change in anticipated federal funds is noted herein for the purpose of indicating the assumptions used relative to these funds."

Renumber succeeding section accordingly.

### CRIMINAL JUSTICE

**SB01-088** be referred to the Committee of the Whole with favorable recommendation.

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
