21 or are candidate species or are likely to become candidate species as  
22 determined by the United States Fish and Wildlife Service; and

23                  WHEREAS, Pursuant to section 24-33-111 (3), Colorado Revised  
24 Statutes, the Executive Director of the Department of Natural Resources,  
25 after consulting with the Colorado Water Conservation Board and its
