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**A BILL FOR AN ACT**

101     **CONCERNING PUBLIC ACCESS TO INFORMATION, AND, IN CONNECTION**  
102             **THEREWITH, PROVIDING FOR PUBLIC ACCESS TO INFORMATION**  
103             **DISCUSSED IN CERTAIN MEETINGS OF PUBLIC BODIES AND**  
104             **PROVIDING REMEDIES AND PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS OF THE**  
105             **OPEN MEETINGS LAW AND THE OPEN RECORDS ACT.**

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**Bill Summary**

*(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not necessarily reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted.)*

Requires discussions that occur during an executive session of a state or local public body, except discussions by a local public body concerning students, to be recorded in the same manner and media in which minutes of open meetings are recorded. Requires the minutes to

include a reference to the statutory citation that authorizes the executive session and the actual content of the discussion. Makes an exception if, based on the opinion of the attorney representing the public body, the discussions constitute a privileged attorney-client communication.

Specifies that no portion of the minutes of an executive session shall be open to public inspection unless a court finds, upon a showing of grounds sufficient to support a reasonable belief that the executive session was held in violation of the open meetings law, and after an in camera review of the minutes of the session, that the executive session was held in violation of the open meetings law. If a court finds an executive session to have been held in contravention of the open meetings law, requires the minutes of the session to be open to public inspection. Authorizes an award of court costs and attorney fees to the prevailing party if the court finds that:

- An applicant seeking access to the minutes of an executive session failed to show grounds sufficient to support a reasonable belief that the executive session was held in violation of the open meetings law; and
- The action was frivolous, vexatious, or groundless.

Requires a state or local public body to include in the public announcement made by the body concerning the topic for discussion in the executive session the following information:

- A reference to the specific statutory citation that authorizes the body to conduct an executive session; and
- The identification of the particular matter to be discussed in as much detail as possible without compromising the purpose for which the executive session was authorized.

Specifies that state or local public bodies are not authorized to meet in an executive session to discuss personnel matters that:

- Concern a member of the state or local public body or an elected official;
- Concern the appointment of a person to fill the office of a member of the state or local public body or an elected official; or
- Do not require the discussion of matters personal to particular employees.

For purposes of records submitted by or on behalf of an applicant or candidate for an executive position, eliminates the requirement that an applicant or candidate who is not a finalist make a written request to avoid release of said records to the public. Modifies the definition of "finalist" to eliminate applicants or candidates who are chosen for an interview or who are still being considered after a certain period, and specifies that a finalist is a member of the final group from which the appointment is made. When a limited specified number of applicants or candidates qualify for the position, specifies that said applicants or candidates are

finalists. Specifies that "executive position" means a position as the chief executive officer of a state agency, institution, or political subdivision.

Authorizes an award of court costs and reasonable attorney fees to the prevailing applicant in an action to compel the custodian of public records to permit the inspection of the records in the event the court finds that the denial of the right to inspect was improper. Authorizes an award of court costs and reasonable attorney fees to the custodian of public records in an action to compel the custodian to permit the inspection of the records in the event the court finds that the denial of the right to inspect was proper and the action was frivolous, vexatious, or groundless. Prohibits an award of court costs and attorney fees to a person seeking access to the records of a state or local public body that the person has sued if the court finds that the records being sought are related to the pending litigation and can be obtained through the discovery process authorized by the Colorado rules of civil procedure. Eliminates the personal liability of a custodian who denies the right of inspection of a public record.

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*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

**SECTION 1.** 24-6-402 (2), Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW PARAGRAPH to read:

**24-6-402. Meetings - open to public.**

(2) (d.5) (I) (A) DISCUSSIONS THAT OCCUR IN AN EXECUTIVE SESSION OF A STATE PUBLIC BODY SHALL BE RECORDED IN THE SAME MANNER AND MEDIA THAT THE STATE PUBLIC BODY USES TO RECORD THE MINUTES OF OPEN MEETINGS. A STATE PUBLIC BODY MAY SATISFY THE RECORDING REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SUB-SUBPARAGRAPH (A) BY MAKING ANY FORM OF ELECTRONIC RECORDING OF THE DISCUSSIONS IN AN EXECUTIVE SESSION OF THE STATE PUBLIC BODY. EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUB-SUBPARAGRAPH (B) OF THIS SUBPARAGRAPH (I), THE MINUTES OF AN EXECUTIVE SESSION SHALL REFLECT THE SPECIFIC CITATION TO THE PROVISION IN SUBSECTION (3) OF THIS SECTION THAT AUTHORIZES THE STATE PUBLIC BODY TO MEET IN AN EXECUTIVE SESSION, THE ACTUAL CONTENTS OF THE DISCUSSION DURING THE SESSION, AND A SIGNED STATEMENT FROM THE CHAIRMAN OF THE

1 EXECUTIVE SESSION ATTESTING THAT ANY WRITTEN MINUTES  
2 SUBSTANTIALLY REFLECT THE SUBSTANCE OF THE DISCUSSIONS DURING THE  
3 EXECUTIVE SESSION. FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SUB-SUBPARAGRAPH (A),  
4 "ACTUAL CONTENTS OF THE DISCUSSION" SHALL NOT BE CONSTRUED TO  
5 REQUIRE THE MINUTES OF AN EXECUTIVE SESSION TO CONTAIN A VERBATIM  
6 TRANSCRIPT OF THE DISCUSSION DURING SAID EXECUTIVE SESSION.

7 (B) IF, IN THE OPINION OF THE ATTORNEY WHO IS REPRESENTING  
8 THE STATE PUBLIC BODY AND IS IN ATTENDANCE AT THE EXECUTIVE  
9 SESSION, ALL OR A PORTION OF THE DISCUSSION DURING THE EXECUTIVE  
10 SESSION CONSTITUTES A PRIVILEGED ATTORNEY-CLIENT COMMUNICATION,  
11 NO RECORD OR MINUTES SHALL BE REQUIRED TO BE KEPT OF THE PART OF  
12 THE DISCUSSION THAT CONSTITUTES A PRIVILEGED ATTORNEY-CLIENT  
13 COMMUNICATION. ANY ELECTRONIC RECORD OF SAID EXECUTIVE SESSION  
14 DISCUSSION SHALL REFLECT THE TOPIC OF DISCUSSION IN THE SAME  
15 MANNER AS DESCRIBED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF PARAGRAPH (d) OF THIS  
16 SUBSECTION (2) AND SHALL REFLECT THAT NO FURTHER RECORD WAS KEPT  
17 OF THE DISCUSSION BASED ON THE OPINION OF THE ATTORNEY  
18 REPRESENTING THE STATE PUBLIC BODY, AS STATED FOR THE RECORD  
19 DURING THE EXECUTIVE SESSION, THAT THE DISCUSSION CONSTITUTES A  
20 PRIVILEGED ATTORNEY-CLIENT COMMUNICATION. ANY WRITTEN MINUTES  
21 SHALL CONTAIN A SIGNED STATEMENT FROM THE ATTORNEY REPRESENTING  
22 THE STATE PUBLIC BODY ATTESTING THAT THE PORTION OF THE EXECUTIVE  
23 SESSION THAT WAS NOT RECORDED CONSTITUTED A PRIVILEGED  
24 ATTORNEY-CLIENT COMMUNICATION IN THE OPINION OF THE ATTORNEY  
25 AND WAS CONFINED TO THE TOPIC AUTHORIZED FOR DISCUSSION IN AN  
26 EXECUTIVE SESSION PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (3) OF THIS SECTION.

27 (C) IF A COURT FINDS, UPON APPLICATION OF A PERSON SEEKING

1 ACCESS TO THE MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE SESSION OF A STATE PUBLIC  
2 BODY IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 24-72-204 (5.5) AND AFTER AN IN  
3 CAMERA REVIEW OF THE MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE SESSION, THAT THE  
4 STATE PUBLIC BODY ENGAGED IN SUBSTANTIAL DISCUSSION OF ANY  
5 MATTERS NOT ENUMERATED IN SUBSECTION (3) OF THIS SECTION OR THAT  
6 THE BODY ADOPTED A PROPOSED POLICY, POSITION, RESOLUTION, RULE,  
7 REGULATION, OR FORMAL ACTION IN THE EXECUTIVE SESSION IN  
8 CONTRAVENTION OF PARAGRAPH (a) OF SUBSECTION (3) OF THIS SECTION,  
9 THE PORTION OF THE MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE SESSION THAT REFLECT  
10 THE SUBSTANTIAL DISCUSSION OF MATTERS NOT ENUMERATED IN  
11 SUBSECTION (3) OF THIS SECTION OR THE ADOPTION OF A PROPOSED POLICY,  
12 POSITION, RESOLUTION, RULE, REGULATION, OR FORMAL ACTION SHALL BE  
13 OPEN TO PUBLIC INSPECTION PURSUANT TO SECTION 24-72-204 (5.5).

14 (D) NO PORTION OF THE MINUTES OF AN EXECUTIVE SESSION OF A  
15 STATE PUBLIC BODY SHALL BE OPEN FOR PUBLIC INSPECTION OR SUBJECT  
16 TO DISCOVERY IN ANY ADMINISTRATIVE OR JUDICIAL PROCEEDING, EXCEPT  
17 UPON THE CONSENT OF THE STATE PUBLIC BODY OR AS PROVIDED IN  
18 SUB-SUBPARAGRAPH (C) OF THIS SUBPARAGRAPH (I) AND SECTION  
19 24-72-204 (5.5).

20 (E) THE MINUTES OF AN EXECUTIVE SESSION OF A STATE PUBLIC  
21 BODY RECORDED PURSUANT TO SUB-SUBPARAGRAPH (A) OF THIS  
22 SUBPARAGRAPH (I) SHALL BE RETAINED FOR AT LEAST NINETY DAYS AFTER  
23 THE DATE OF THE EXECUTIVE SESSION.

24 (II) (A) DISCUSSIONS THAT OCCUR IN AN EXECUTIVE SESSION OF A  
25 LOCAL PUBLIC BODY SHALL BE RECORDED IN THE SAME MANNER AND  
26 MEDIA THAT THE LOCAL PUBLIC BODY USES TO RECORD THE MINUTES OF  
27 OPEN MEETINGS. A LOCAL PUBLIC BODY MAY SATISFY THE RECORDING

1 REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SUB-SUBPARAGRAPH (A) BY MAKING ANY FORM OF  
2 ELECTRONIC RECORDING OF THE DISCUSSIONS IN AN EXECUTIVE SESSION OF  
3 THE LOCAL PUBLIC BODY. EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUB-SUBPARAGRAPH  
4 (B) OF THIS SUBPARAGRAPH (II), THE MINUTES OF AN EXECUTIVE SESSION  
5 SHALL REFLECT THE SPECIFIC CITATION TO THE PROVISION IN SUBSECTION  
6 (4) OF THIS SECTION THAT AUTHORIZES THE LOCAL PUBLIC BODY TO MEET  
7 IN AN EXECUTIVE SESSION, THE ACTUAL CONTENTS OF THE DISCUSSION  
8 DURING THE SESSION, AND A SIGNED STATEMENT FROM THE CHAIRMAN OF  
9 THE EXECUTIVE SESSION ATTESTING THAT ANY WRITTEN MINUTES  
10 SUBSTANTIALLY REFLECT THE SUBSTANCE OF THE DISCUSSIONS DURING THE  
11 EXECUTIVE SESSION. FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SUB-SUBPARAGRAPH (A),  
12 "ACTUAL CONTENTS OF THE DISCUSSION" SHALL NOT BE CONSTRUED TO  
13 REQUIRE THE MINUTES OF AN EXECUTIVE SESSION TO CONTAIN A VERBATIM  
14 TRANSCRIPT OF THE DISCUSSION DURING SAID EXECUTIVE SESSION. THE  
15 PROVISIONS OF THIS SUB-SUBPARAGRAPH (A) SHALL NOT APPLY TO  
16 DISCUSSIONS OF INDIVIDUAL STUDENTS BY A LOCAL PUBLIC BODY  
17 PURSUANT TO PARAGRAPH (h) OF SUBSECTION (4) OF THIS SECTION.

18 (B) IF, IN THE OPINION OF THE ATTORNEY WHO IS REPRESENTING  
19 THE LOCAL PUBLIC BODY AND WHO IS IN ATTENDANCE AT THE EXECUTIVE  
20 SESSION, ALL OR A PORTION OF THE DISCUSSION DURING THE EXECUTIVE  
21 SESSION CONSTITUTES A PRIVILEGED ATTORNEY-CLIENT COMMUNICATION,  
22 NO RECORD OR MINUTES SHALL BE REQUIRED TO BE KEPT OF THE PART OF  
23 THE DISCUSSION THAT CONSTITUTES A PRIVILEGED ATTORNEY-CLIENT  
24 COMMUNICATION. ANY ELECTRONIC RECORD OF SAID EXECUTIVE SESSION

4 PRIVILEGED ATTORNEY-CLIENT COMMUNICATION. ANY WRITTEN MINUTES  
5 SHALL CONTAIN A SIGNED STATEMENT FROM THE ATTORNEY REPRESENTING  
6 THE LOCAL PUBLIC BODY ATTESTING THAT THE PORTION OF THE EXECUTIVE  
7 SESSION THAT WAS NOT RECORDED CONSTITUTED A PRIVILEGED  
8 ATTORNEY-CLIENT COMMUNICATION IN THE OPINION OF THE ATTORNEY  
9 AND WAS CONFINED TO THE TOPIC AUTHORIZED FOR DISCUSSION IN AN  
10 EXECUTIVE SESSION PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (4) OF THIS SECTION.

11 (C) IF A COURT FINDS, UPON APPLICATION OF A PERSON SEEKING  
12 ACCESS TO THE MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE SESSION OF A LOCAL PUBLIC  
13 BODY IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 24-72-204 (5.5) AND AFTER AN IN  
14 CAMERA REVIEW OF THE MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE SESSION, THAT THE  
15 LOCAL PUBLIC BODY ENGAGED IN SUBSTANTIAL DISCUSSION OF ANY  
16 MATTERS NOT ENUMERATED IN SUBSECTION (4) OF THIS SECTION OR THAT  
17 THE BODY ADOPTED A PROPOSED POLICY, POSITION, RESOLUTION, RULE,  
18 REGULATION, OR FORMAL ACTION IN THE EXECUTIVE SESSION IN  
19 CONTRAVENTION OF SUBSECTION (4) OF THIS SECTION, THE PORTION OF THE  
20 MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE SESSION THAT REFLECT THE SUBSTANTIAL  
21 DISCUSSION OF MATTERS NOT ENUMERATED IN SUBSECTION (4) OF THIS  
22 SECTION OR THE ADOPTION OF A PROPOSED POLICY, POSITION, RESOLUTION,

25 (D) NO PORTION OF THE MINUTES OF AN EXECUTIVE SESSION OF A  
26 LOCAL PUBLIC BODY SHALL BE OPEN FOR PUBLIC INSPECTION OR SUBJECT  
27 TO DISCOVERY IN ANY ADMINISTRATIVE OR JUDICIAL PROCEEDING, EXCEPT

1 UPON THE CONSENT OF THE LOCAL PUBLIC BODY OR AS PROVIDED IN  
2 SUB-SUBPARAGRAPH (C) OF THIS SUBPARAGRAPH (II) AND SECTION  
3 24-72-204 (5.5).

4 (E) THE MINUTES OF AN EXECUTIVE SESSION OF A LOCAL PUBLIC  
5 BODY RECORDED PURSUANT TO SUB-SUBPARAGRAPH (A) OF THIS  
6 SUBPARAGRAPH (II) SHALL BE RETAINED FOR AT LEAST NINETY DAYS AFTER  
7 THE DATE OF THE EXECUTIVE SESSION.

8 **SECTION 2.** The introductory portions to 24-6-402 (3) (a) and  
9 (4) and 24-6-402 (3) (b) and (4) (f), Colorado Revised Statutes, are  
10 amended to read:

11 **24-6-402. Meetings - open to public.** (3) (a) The members of a  
12 state public body subject to this part 4, upon the announcement by the  
13 state public body to the public of the topic for discussion in the executive  
14 session, INCLUDING SPECIFIC CITATION TO THE PROVISION OF THIS  
15 SUBSECTION (3) AUTHORIZING THE BODY TO MEET IN AN EXECUTIVE  
16 SESSION AND IDENTIFICATION OF THE PARTICULAR MATTER TO BE  
17 DISCUSSED IN AS MUCH DETAIL AS POSSIBLE WITHOUT COMPROMISING THE  
18 PURPOSE FOR WHICH THE EXECUTIVE SESSION IS AUTHORIZED, and the  
19 affirmative vote of two-thirds of the entire membership of the body after  
20 such announcement, may hold an executive session only at a regular or  
21 special meeting and for the sole purpose of considering any of the matters  
22 enumerated in paragraph (b) of this subsection (3) or the following  
23 matters; except that no adoption of any proposed policy, position,  
24 resolution, rule, regulation, or formal action, EXCEPT THE REVIEW,  
25 APPROVAL, AND AMENDMENT OF THE MINUTES OF AN EXECUTIVE SESSION  
26 RECORDED PURSUANT TO SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF PARAGRAPH (d.5) OF  
27 SUBSECTION (2) OF THIS SECTION, shall occur at any executive session that

2 (b) (I) All meetings held by members of a state public body subject  
3 to this part 4 to consider the appointment or employment of a public  
4 official or employee or the dismissal, discipline, promotion, demotion, or  
5 compensation of, or the investigation of charges or complaints against, a  
6 public official or employee shall be open to the public unless said  
7 applicant, official, or employee requests an executive session. Governing  
8 boards of institutions of higher education including the regents of the  
9 university of Colorado may, upon their own affirmative vote, hold  
10 executive sessions to consider the matters listed in this paragraph (b).  
11 Executive sessions may be held to review administrative actions regarding  
12 investigation of charges or complaints and attendant investigative reports  
13 against students where public disclosure could adversely affect the person  
14 or persons involved, unless the students have specifically consented to or  
15 requested the disclosure of such matters. An executive session may be  
16 held only at a regular or special meeting of the state public body and only  
17 upon the announcement by the public body to the public of the topic for  
18 discussion in the executive session and the affirmative vote of two-thirds  
19 of the entire membership of the body after such announcement.

4 EXECUTIVE SESSION AND IDENTIFICATION OF THE PARTICULAR MATTER TO  
5 BE DISCUSSED IN AS MUCH DETAIL AS POSSIBLE WITHOUT COMPROMISING  
6 THE PURPOSE FOR WHICH THE EXECUTIVE SESSION IS AUTHORIZED, and the  
7 affirmative vote of two-thirds of the quorum present, after such  
8 announcement, may hold an executive session only at a regular or special  
9 meeting and for the sole purpose of considering any of the following  
10 matters; except that no adoption of any proposed policy, position,  
11 resolution, rule, regulation, or formal action, EXCEPT THE REVIEW,  
12 APPROVAL, AND AMENDMENT OF THE MINUTES OF AN EXECUTIVE SESSION  
13 RECORDED PURSUANT TO SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF PARAGRAPH (d.5) OF  
14 SUBSECTION (2) OF THIS SECTION, shall occur at any executive session that  
15 is not open to the public:

16 (f) (I) Personnel matters except if the employee who is the subject  
17 of the session has requested an open meeting, or if the personnel matter  
18 involves more than one employee, all of the employees have requested an

7 (1.3) "Executive position" means any nonelective employment  
8 position ~~with~~ AS THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF a state agency,  
9 institution, or political subdivision OR AGENCY THEREOF, except  
10 employment positions in the state personnel system or employment  
11 positions in a classified system or civil service system of an institution or  
12 political subdivision.

13 **SECTION 4.** 24-72-204 (3) (a) (XI) (A) and (5), Colorado  
14 Revised Statutes, are amended, and the said 24-72-204 is further amended  
15 BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SUBSECTION, to read:

16 **24-72-204. Allowance or denial of inspection - grounds -  
17 procedure - appeal.** (3) (a) The custodian shall deny the right of  
18 inspection of the following records, unless otherwise provided by law;  
19 except that any of the following records, other than letters of reference  
20 concerning employment, licensing, or issuance of permits, shall be  
21 available to the person in interest under this subsection (3):
