A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING FAITH HEALING IN THE CRIME OF CHILD ABUSE.**

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not necessarily reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted.)

Repeals the faith healing exception to the crime of child abuse.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1. Repeal.** 18-6-401 (6), Colorado Revised Statutes,

3 is repealed as follows:

4 **18-6-401. Child abuse.** (6) ~~A parent, guardian, or legal custodian~~

1 ~~who chooses and legitimately practices treatment by spiritual means~~
2 ~~through prayer in accordance with section 19-3-103, C.R.S., shall not be~~

9 **SECTION 2. Effective date - applicability.** This act shall take
10 effect July 1, 2001, and shall apply to offenses committed on or after said

12 **SECTION 3. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
13 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
14 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
