EXECUTIVE ORDER AMENDMENT

Amending Executive Order D 011 01

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Office of the Governor of the State of Colorado, and in particular vested in the Governor pursuant to Article IV, Section 9 of the Colorado Constitution, and as provided for in Article V, Section 7, I, Bill Owens, Governor of the State of Colorado, hereby issue this Executive Order amending Executive Order D 011 01 and designating an additional subject for consideration during the second special session of the Sixty-Third General Assembly.

"(7) (a) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS SECTION, NO COUNTY SHALL BE REQUIRED TO AMEND OR READOPT ITS MASTER PLAN AS OTHERWISE REQUIRED BY THIS SECTION, IF, BY THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION, AS AMENDED, THE COUNTY HAS ALREADY:

(I) ADOPTED A COUNTY-WIDE MASTER PLAN WHICH SUBSTANTIALLY COMPLIES WITH THE REQUIRED ELEMENTS GOVERNING COUNTY COMPREHENSIVE PLANS AS STATED IN THIS SECTION; AND

(II) IMPLEMENTED OR REQUIRED COMPLIANCE WITH THAT PLAN THROUGH ITS ZONING AND OTHER APPLICABLE LAND USE REGULATIONS.

(b) ANY SUCH PLAN NOT REQUIRED TO BE AMENDED OR READOPTED HEREUNDER SHALL STILL BE REQUIRED TO BE REVIEWED EVERY FIVE YEARS FOLLOWING JULY 1, 2003, PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION _____ OF THIS SECTION.".
