Appropriations

After consideration on the merits, the committee recommends that **SB01S-014** be amended as follows and, as so amended be referred to the Committee of the Whole with favorable recommendation.

Amend printed bill, page 5, after line 7, insert the following,

"SECTION 3. No appropriation. The general assembly has determined that this act can be implemented within existing appropriations for travel, and therefore no separate appropriation of state moneys for travel is necessary to carry out the purposes of this act.".

Renumber succeeding sections accordingly.
