WHEREAS, According to Policy 803.0 established by the Transportation Commission of the state of Colorado and the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices, federal rule 2D-49, the General Assembly of Colorado by resolution may designate a component of the state highway system in honor of Representative Gary McPherson; now, therefore,

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Sixty-third General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the Senate concurring herein:

(1) That the new flyover structure connecting northwest-bound Parker Road to southbound Interstate 225 shall be named the "Gary McPherson Flyover" in honor of former State Representative Gary McPherson.

(2) That the Colorado Department of Transportation may accept and expend gifts, grants, donations, and federal funds for the purposes of the initial placement of signs to mark the designated sections of Parker Road and Interstate 225 as the "Gary McPherson Flyover".

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(3) That the Colorado Department of Transportation may explore a cooperative agreement with the Commissioners of Arapahoe County and the City of Aurora for the maintenance of the markings for the highway.

Be It Further Resolved, That copies of this Joint Resolution be sent to Representative McPherson's wife Shelley, his three daughters, Christina, Elizabeth, and Ashley McPherson, his parents, Ivan and Vickie McPherson, the Transportation Commission of Colorado, the Colorado Department of Transportation, the Commissioners of Arapahoe County, the City of Aurora, and the Governor of Colorado.

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WHEREAS, As the primary decision-makers for choices in family

 health care, women account for the allocation of two of every three health care dollars; and

WHEREAS, There is evidence that women are under-treated compared to men; and

WHEREAS, There is abundant evidence that women are under-represented in health studies; and

WHEREAS, Although there has been some national attention directed to women's health care issues, and some legislative activity by the Congress on access issues, yet there remains little change in vitally important preventive care and treatment issues; and

WHEREAS, Women have the right to receive quality treatment and access to the latest technologies and appropriate diagnostic tests; and

WHEREAS, The Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, with direction from the general assembly and opportunities offered by the federal government, has already taken the following steps to achieve improved and equal access for women to quality health care:

- (a) Established a women's health section to address the emerging needs of Colorado women; and
- (b) Created an arthritis, cardiovascular disease, physical fitness, wellness, and diabetes program with a focus on women; and
- (c) Implemented a special women and smoking program in the state tobacco program to promote nonsmoking among women; and
- (d) Maintains the Colorado women's cancer control initiative program, which includes the new efforts regarding detection and treatment for breast and cervical cancer; and
 - (e) Is seeking a grant to address osteoporosis; and
- (f) Has begun a community planning process to develop a strategic plan on women's health; now, therefore,

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Sixty-third General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the Senate concurring herein:

That it is the sense of the General Assembly of the state of Colorado that, to achieve improved and equal access for women to quality health care, every state agency and state-chartered institution of learning or recipient of state grants or funding is encouraged to take appropriate action to:

- (1) Provide women equal access to quality health care, including state-of-the-art medical advances and technology;
- (2) Increase the number of women covered by comprehensive health care insurance, including primary and preventive health care for all women;

- (3) Prevent serious health problems with timely diagnosis and treatment programs;
- (4) Promote strategies to increase patient access to recommended diagnostic and screening tests, preventive health regimens, and recommended treatments;
- (5) Encourage unimpeded access to women's specialty health providers;
- (6) Create and promote public and private partnerships to create programs designed to improve the scope and quality of women's health care;
 - (7) Improve communications between providers and patients;
- (8) Continue to expand participation of women of color in clinical trials;
- (9) Increase government and private research on women's health issues and the differences between men and women and how such differences affect the quality of health care received by each;
- (10) Conduct more health outcomes research to demonstrate the value of women's health care interventions and preventive health measures in both the short term and the long term;
- (11) Expand medical and nursing school curricula in the area of women's health and expand education about gender biology;
- (12) Support public education campaigns that increase women's awareness about their unique health risks and instruct women how to negotiate the complexities of today's health care system to obtain the best care available;
- (13) Continue to conduct public health campaigns via state and local departments of public health with private-sector partners to focus on key women's preventive health issues;
- (14) Foster development and dissemination of publicly available information on the quality of health care and health outcomes that improve women's ability to choose the best women's health care plan; and
- (15) Expand state screening programs targeted at lower-income women to include a full range of known risk factors.
- Be It Further Resolved, That it is the sense of the General Assembly to commend the organization Women in Government for its leadership and enterprise in expressing to Colorado the appropriate urgency of need and meaningful steps that can be taken to attain improved and equal access for women to quality health care, technologies, and treatments; education of researchers about gender differences; and unimpeded access to women's health providers.
