24 SIGNATURE FOR USE BY ANY OTHER PUBLIC ENTITY IN CARRYING OUT ITS
25 FUNCTIONS, OR THE SALE, DISCLOSURE, OR RELEASE OF A PHOTOCOPIED OR
26 MICROFILMED IMAGE OF AN ELECTOR'S SIGNATURE.
