Therefore, this bill becomes state law at 12:01 am on April 23. This letter 21 sets forth my reasoning for letting the bill become law without my signature. 23 As Governor, I am concerned about allowing the sale of alcoholic beverages on campuses. 24 However, vetoing this bill may put those institutions that hold liquor licenses at a 25 disadvantage with those that operate through a vendor. 26 The consumption of alcohol on Colorado college and university campuses, particularly binge 28 drinking, continues to be a major problem. Just last month both the Rocky Mountain News 29 and the Denver Post reported that the rate of binge drinking at the University of Colorado 30 exceeded the national average. 31 32 Across the country, and in Colorado, college drinking has lead to alcohol poisoning, drunk 33 driving accidents and too many tragic deaths. A study concerning college drinking released 34 at the beginning of April by the National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism blames 35 1.5 million injuries and 70,000 sexual assaults on binge drinking on college campuses. 36 37 As a parent I know that college binge drinking is a great concern. A recent survey of parents 38 of college students showed that 95 percent felt that excessive drinking is a serious threat to 39 their children's safety and that 85 percent felt that access to alcohol in college contributes to 40 the problem. 42 Colorado colleges and universities continue to work to reduce drinking. It is my hope that 43 these institutions will work with the liquor industry to help teach students to legally and 44 45 responsibly use alcohol.
