SECTION 3. The introductory portion to 39-30-103 (1), Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

39-30-103. Zones established - termination. (1) Any municipality, county, or group of contiguous municipalities or counties may propose an area of such municipality, county, or group of municipalities or counties to be designated as an enterprise zone if the area has a population of no more than eighty thousand persons, OR, IN THE CASE OF AN ENTERPRISE ZONE LOCATED IN A RURAL AREA, ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND PERSONS, and meets at least one of the following additional criteria:

SECTION 4. 39-30-103.5, Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SUBSECTION to read:

39-30-103.5. Credit against tax - contributions to enterprise zone administrators to implement economic development plans. (3.5) FOR INCOME TAX YEARS COMMENCING ON AND AFTER JANUARY 1, 2003, MONETARY OR IN-KIND CONTRIBUTIONS TO PROMOTE NONPROFIT OR GOVERNMENT-FUNDED COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS IN ENTERPRISE ZONES SHALL BE DEEMED TO BE FOR THE PURPOSE OF IMPLEMENTING THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PLAN FOR THE ENTERPRISE ZONE."
