(2) (a) (VI) Notwithstanding subparagraph (III) of this paragraph (a), the division shall not assess a fee for work performed to negotiate a voluntary agreement under part 12 of this article above a maximum of one TWO hundred FIFTY hours at a rate of fifty-nine dollars and ninety-eight cents per hour unless the owner or operator proposing the voluntary agreement consents to a greater fee in writing.".

NOTHING IN THIS SUB-SUBPARAGRAPH (A) SHALL APPLY TO ANY PERSON EMPLOYED BY AN ORGANIZATION THAT WAS LISTED IN THE DEFINITION OF "PEACE OFFICER, LEVEL I," PRIOR TO JANUARY 1, 2002.
- (B) Any person employed by any organization that is added to the definition of "peace officer, level I," on or after January 1, 2002, shall be required to complete a minimum of forty hours of continuing law enforcement education per year, or such number of hours otherwise required by law, in order to continue to be classified as "peace officer, level I". Nothing in this sub-subparagraph (B) shall apply to any person employed by
