41 said sales taxes, or both, in excess of such amount shall be allocated to

44 connection with the bonds of, loans or advances to, or indebtedness
45 incurred by, whether funded, refunded, assumed, or otherwise, the
46 municipality for financing or refinancing, in whole or in part, a
47 development project within the boundaries of the plan of development
48 area. Any excess municipal sales tax collection not allocated pursuant to
49 this subparagraph (II) shall be paid into the funds of the municipality.
50 Unless and until the total valuation for assessment of the taxable property
51 within the boundaries of the plan of development area exceeds the base
52 valuation for assessment of the taxable property within such boundaries,
53 as provided in subparagraph (I) of this paragraph (a), all of the taxes
54 levied upon the taxable property in such boundary area shall be paid into
55 the funds of the respective public bodies. Unless and until the total
56 municipal sales tax collections in the plan of development area exceed the

1 base year municipal sales tax collections in such area, as provided in
2 subparagraph (I) of this paragraph (a), all such sales tax collections shall
3 be paid into the funds of the municipality. When such bonds, loans,
4 advances, and indebtedness, if any, including interest thereon and any
5 premiums due in connection therewith, and including any refunding
6 securities therefor, have been paid, all taxes upon the taxable property or
7 the total municipal sales tax collections, or both, in such boundary area
8 shall be paid into the funds of the respective public bodies. THE
9 PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBPARAGRAPH (II) SHALL APPLY AS FOLLOWS:

10

11 (A) FOR THE FIRST TWENTY-FIVE YEARS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE
12 DATE OF APPROVAL BY A GOVERNING BODY, SUCH EXCESS PORTION SHALL
13 INCLUDE ANY TAX LEVIED UPON TAXABLE PROPERTY WITHIN THE
14 BOUNDARIES OF THE PLAN OF DEVELOPMENT OR THE MUNICIPAL SALES
15 TAX, OR BOTH.
