20 THE EMPLOYEE REPORTS THE ON-THE-JOB EXPOSURE. THE EMPLOYEE
21 MUST REPORT THE EXPOSURE WITHIN TWO DAYS AFTER THE EMPLOYEE
22 KNEW OR REASONABLY SHOULD HAVE KNOWN OF THE EXPOSURE;
23

24 (b) THE BASELINE TEST ESTABLISHES THAT THE EMPLOYEE WAS
25 NOT INFECTED WITH HEPATITIS C AT THE TIME OF THE ON-THE-JOB
26 EXPOSURE;
27

28 (c) THE EMPLOYEE COMPLIES WITH REASONABLE AND NECESSARY
29 MEDICAL PROCEDURES SET FORTH IN SECTION 8-42-101 (1) (c);
30

31 (d) THE EMPLOYEE IS DETERMINED TO HAVE HEPATITIS C WITHIN
32 TWENTY-FOUR MONTHS AFTER THE ON-THE-JOB EXPOSURE TO THE KNOWN
33 OR POSSIBLE SOURCE.

35 (2) THE EXPOSURE TO OR CONTRACTION OF HEPATITIS C BY A
36 FIREFIGHTER, EMERGENCY SERVICES PROVIDER, OR PEACE OFFICER, AS
37 DEFINED IN SECTION 18-1-901 (3) (1), C.R.S., SHALL NOT BE DEEMED TO BE
38 WITHIN THE COURSE AND SCOPE OF EMPLOYMENT IF AN EMPLOYER OR
39 INSURER SHOWS BY A PREPONDERANCE OF THE EVIDENCE THAT SUCH
40 EXPOSURE OR CONTRACTION DID NOT OCCUR ON THE JOB.

50 18-1-901 (3) (1), C.R.S., IS EXPOSED DURING THE COURSE AND WITHIN THE

52 C, THE EMPLOYER, OR IF INSURED, THE INSURER, SHALL, AT THEIR
53 EXPENSE, PROVIDE FOR BASELINE TESTING WITHIN THE PERIOD OF TIME
54 SPECIFIED IN SECTION 8-41-208 (1) (a) TO DETERMINE WHETHER THE
55 EMPLOYEE WAS FREE OF HEPATITIS C AT THE TIME OF THE ON-THE-JOB
56 EXPOSURE. THE EMPLOYER, OR IF INSURED, THE INSURER, SHALL PAY FOR

1 ALL REASONABLE AND NECESSARY MEDICAL PROCEDURES AND
2 TREATMENT FOR EXPOSURE TO HEPATITIS C DURING THE PERIOD OF TIME
3 SET FORTH IN SECTION 8-41-208 (1) (d).

5 **SECTION 3. Effective date - applicability.** This act shall take
6 effect upon passage and shall apply to claims for workers' compensation
7 arising on or after said date.

9 **SECTION 4. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
10 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
