WHEREAS, The comment to a reporter by Trygve Bauge's mother, "I don't know what I'm supposed to do with the dead bodies in the shed", led to the international incident in Nederland, Colorado, which

became known locally as the "tale of the frozen dead guy"; and

WHEREAS, Sisters Robin, Shelley, and Kathy Beeck produced and directed the film "Grandpa's in the Tuff Shed" in 1998, and won the "Best Short Documentary" award at the Breckenridge Film Festival and the Durango Film Festival, the Phil Loyd Award at the Telluride Mountain Film Festival, and an honorable mention for Best Documentary at the South Beach Film Festival in Florida, and toured 150 cities nationally and internationally in the Best of Banff Tour from the Banff Mountain Film Festival in Canada; and

WHEREAS, Fame and international intrigue were welcomed with open arms by the small town of Nederland, Colorado; and

 WHEREAS, Dry ice continues to be delivered to the now infamous shed and current resting place of Grandpa Bredo on a biweekly basis; and

WHEREAS, Grandpa Bredo, otherwise known as "The Frozen Dead Guy", has been a model citizen, never giving the cold shoulder to anyone, and has responded to widespread adulation with icy resolve and a stiff upper lip; and

WHEREAS, The town of Nederland has embraced Grandpa Bredo, arguably its coldest citizen, with a warmth that could almost melt dry ice; and

WHEREAS, On March 9 and 10, 2002, the town of Nederland, Colorado, will celebrate the first annual "Frozen Dead Guy Days" festival with parades, a swim in Barker Reservoir, Coffin Races, a Grandpa Bredo Lookalike Contest, a feature screening of the film "Grandpa's in the Tuff Shed", and more; now, therefore,

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Sixty-third General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the Senate concurring herein:

That we, the members of the Sixty-Third General Assembly, hereby declare March 9, 2002, Colorado "Frozen Dead Guy Day".
