WHEREAS, Tuesday, April 16, symbolizes the day on which wages paid to an American woman catch up to the wages paid to a man from the previous year; and

WHEREAS, Fair pay strengthens the security of families, eases future retirement costs, and enhances the American economy; and

WHEREAS, Equity in policies related to wages may be implemented simply and without burdensome costs; and

WHEREAS, Undervaluing a woman's work contributes to difficulties in recruiting and retaining employees in professions that predominately attract women, such as nursing and teaching; and

WHEREAS, A vast majority of households depend on the wages 56 of a working mother and these working families are often just one
