REPORTS OF COMMITTEE OF REFERENCE 1 -3 **CRIMINAL JUSTICE** After consideration on the merits, the Committee recommends the 5 following: 6 7 **HB02-1021** be amended as follows, and as so amended, be referred to 8 the Committee of the Whole with favorable 9 recommendation: 10 11 Amend printed bill, page 2, line 2, after "(2)", insert "(a)"; 12 13 line 5, strike "FIVE BUSINESS" and substitute "THIRTY"; 14 line 6, strike "ANY" and substitute "EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN 15 16 THIS SUBSECTION (2), ANY"; 17 18 line 9, strike "THEREAFTER," and substitute "AFTER THE DATE OF THE 19 SCHEDULED PAROLE HEARING."; 20 21 after line 11, insert the following: "(b) NOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISIONS OF PARAGRAPH (a) OF THIS SUBSECTION (2), AN INMATE WHO WAIVES PAROLE CONSIDERATION 24 MAY, NO LATER THAN THIRTY DAYS PRIOR TO THE DATE OF THE SCHEDULED PAROLE HEARING, MAKE A WRITTEN REQUEST THAT THE 26 SIX-MONTH WAIVER PERIOD BE SHORTENED TO A LESSER PERIOD OF TIME. 27 SUCH REQUEST SHALL SPECIFICALLY STATE GROUNDS CONSTITUTING 28 SUFFICIENT AND REASONABLE CAUSE AS TO WHY THE SIX-MONTH WAIVER 29 PERIOD SHOULD BE SHORTENED. SUCH REQUEST SHALL ALSO 30 SPECIFICALLY STATE THE LESSER PERIOD OF TIME BEING REQUESTED BY THE INMATE. THE CHAIRPERSON OF THE BOARD, VICE-CHAIRPERSON OF THE BOARD, OR THE DESIGNEE OF EITHER, IN HIS OR HER DISCRETION, SHALL GRANT OR DENY THE INMATE'S REQUEST FOR THE SHORTENED WAIVER PERIOD MADE UNDER THIS PARAGRAPH (b). 35 36 (c) If the inmate's request for the shortened waiver period IS MADE AND GRANTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH PARAGRAPH (b) OF THIS SUBSECTION (2), THE INMATE MAY NOT, AT ANY TIME PRIOR TO THE DATE OF THE RESCHEDULED PAROLE HEARING, MAKE ANOTHER SUCH REQUEST. 40 In the event such inmate is not prepared for or otherwise not 41 READY TO PROCEED AT THE RESCHEDULED PAROLE HEARING, THE INMATE SHALL BE DEEMED TO HAVE WAIVED PAROLE CONSIDERATION FOR A 43 PERIOD OF SIX MONTHS FOLLOWING THE DATE OF SUCH HEARING.". 44 45 HB02-1077 be amended as follows, and as so amended, be referred to 47 the Committee of the Whole with favorable 48 recommendation: 49 50 Amend printed bill, page 2, line 15, strike "PERIOD," and substitute 51 "PERIOD.":
