46 a healthy nation that increasingly relies on the prompt, efficient delivery  
47 of primary and preventive health care; and

49 WHEREAS, A renewed emphasis on primary and preventive  
50 health care will require the better utilization of all of our nation's  
51 registered nursing resources; and

52  
53 WHEREAS, Professional nursing has been demonstrated to be an  
54 indispensable component in the safety and quality of care of patients in  
55 all health care settings; and

56

1 WHEREAS, The demand for registered nursing services will be  
 2 greater than ever because of the aging of the American population, the  
 3 continuing expansion of life-sustaining technology, and the explosive  
 4 growth of home health care services; and

5  
 6 WHEREAS, A greater number of qualified registered nurses will  
 7 be needed in the future to meet the increasingly complex needs of health  
 8 care consumers in this community; and

9  
 10 WHEREAS, The cost-effective, safe, and high-quality health care  
 11 services provided by registered nurses will be an ever more important  
 12 component of the U.S. health care delivery system in the future; and

13  
 14 WHEREAS, Along with the American Nurses Association, the  
 15 Colorado Nurses Association has declared the week of May 6-12 as  
 16 National Nurses Week 2002, with the theme "Nurses Care for America",  
 17 in celebration of the ways in which registered nurses strive to provide  
 18 safe and high quality patient care and map out the way to improve our  
 19 health care system; now, therefore,

20  
 21 *Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Sixty-third*  
 22 *General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the Senate concurring*  
 23 *herein:*

24  
 25 That we, the Colorado General Assembly, ask that all residents of  
 26 Colorado join us in honoring the registered nurses who care for all of us.

27  
 28 *Be It Further Resolved,* That the residents of Colorado celebrate  
 29 registered nursing's accomplishments and efforts to improve our health  
 30 care system and show our appreciation for the nation's registered nurses  
 31 not just during this week, but at every opportunity throughout the year.
