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"SECTION 1. 42-5-204 (1) (a), Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

42-5-204. Inspection fees - vehicle number inspection funds. (1) (a) A fee of twenty dollars shall be charged for each inspection performed pursuant to this part 2. IN ADDITION, WHEN A STATE SALVAGE IDENTIFICATION NUMBER (SSIN) HAS BEEN ASSIGNED PURSUANT TO SECTION 42-6-108 (3), AN ADDITIONAL FEE MAY BE CHARGED TO COVER THE DIRECT COSTS OF PRODUCING AND AFFIXING THE SSIN PLATE REQUIRED BY SAID SECTION. Upon payment of the fee, the owner of the vehicle or commercial vehicle inspected shall be issued a receipt as evidence of payment.

SECTION 2. 42-5-205, Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

42-5-205. Assignment of a special vehicle identification number by the department of revenue. The department of revenue is authorized to assign a special vehicle identification number to any street rod vehicle, BRANDED VEHICLE, OR REBUILT SALVAGE VEHICLE whenever required by section 42-6-108 and to any vehicle or commercial vehicle whenever no vehicle identification number is found on the vehicle or whenever a vehicle identification number has been removed, changed, altered, or obliterated. In the case of a branded vehicle or rebuilt salvage VEHICLE, THE SPECIAL VEHICLE IDENTIFICATION NUMBER SHALL BE THE STATE SALVAGE IDENTIFICATION NUMBER AS DEFINED IN SECTION 42-6-102 (14.5). Such special number shall be affixed to the vehicle or commercial vehicle in the manner and position SPECIFIED IN SECTION 42-6-108 (3), IF APPLICABLE, OR OTHERWISE AS determined by the department of revenue. Such special number shall then be the vehicle identification number required to be recorded by an inspector on the inspection form that is transmitted to the executive director of the department of revenue, and the vehicle or commercial vehicle shall then be registered and titled under the special vehicle identification number.

SECTION 3. 42-6-108, Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SUBSECTION to read:

- 42-6-108. Identification number title street rod vehicles **salvage vehicles.** (3) When application is made to the state for A CERTIFICATE OF TITLE TO A BRANDED VEHICLE OR A REBUILT SALVAGE VEHICLE, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL, WITHIN SIXTY DAYS, ASSIGN A STATE SALVAGE IDENTIFICATION NUMBER (SSIN) TO SUCH VEHICLE AND SHALL TAKE THE FOLLOWING ADDITIONAL STEPS:
- (a) THE OWNER SHALL BE REQUIRED TO SURRENDER ALL EXISTING DOCUMENTS OF TITLE. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL THEN ISSUE TO THE OWNER A SUBSTITUTE CERTIFICATE OF TITLE BEARING THE SSIN IN THE SAME DATA FIELD AS THE VEHICLE'S ORIGINAL VEHICLE IDENTIFICATION NUMBER (VIN). THE SUBSTITUTE CERTIFICATE OF TITLE AND ANY SUBSEOUENT REGISTRATION DOCUMENTS FOR SUCH VEHICLE SHALL BE PRINTED ON A DIFFERENT-COLORED AND CLEARLY DISTINGUISHABLE PAPER STOCK AND SHALL BEAR AN INDELIBLE WATERMARK READING "SALVAGE".
 - (b) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL TRANSMIT THE SSIN TO THE

COLORADO STATE PATROL OR OTHER LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY CONDUCTING AN INSPECTION OF THE VEHICLE UNDER PART 2 OF ARTICLE 5 OF THIS TITLE, AND AT ANY SUCH INSPECTION THE INSPECTOR SHALL 4 PERMANENTLY INSTALL A METAL PLATE BEARING THE SSIN ON THE B-PILLAR DOOR FRAME, IMMEDIATELY ADJACENT TO, BUT NOT OBSCURING, 6 THE EXISTING VIN.

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SECTION 4. 42-6-102, Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended BY THE ADDITION OF THE FOLLOWING NEW SUBSECTIONS to read:

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42-6-102. Definitions. As used in this part 1, unless the context otherwise requires:

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(1.5) "Branded Vehicle" means a vehicle that has been 16 REGISTERED IN ANOTHER STATE USING THE DESIGNATION "BRANDED" OR AN EQUIVALENT DESIGNATION, AS LISTED IN A NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED 18 Publication by the American association of motor vehicle 19 ADMINISTRATORS OR A SUCCESSOR ORGANIZATION.

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(10.2) "REBUILT SALVAGE VEHICLE" MEANS A SALVAGE VEHICLE OR BRANDED VEHICLE THAT HAS BEEN MADE ROADWORTHY, EITHER WITH OR WITHOUT THE SUBSTITUTION OF PARTS FROM OTHER VEHICLES.

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(14.5) "STATE SALVAGE IDENTIFICATION NUMBER" OR "SSIN" 26 MEANS A SPECIAL VEHICLE IDENTIFICATION NUMBER USED TO IDENTIFY BRANDED VEHICLES AND REBUILT SALVAGE VEHICLES IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 42-6-108 (3). THE STATE SALVAGE IDENTIFICATION 29 NUMBER SHALL CONSIST OF SEVENTEEN LETTERS AND NUMBERS. THE 30 FIRST TWO LETTERS SHALL BE "CO". THE NEXT SEVEN LETTERS SHALL BE "SALVAGE". NEXT SHALL BE A LETTER OR NUMBER TO DENOTE THE YEAR OF ORIGINAL MANUFACTURE OF SUCH VEHICLE, WHICH SHALL BE 33 FOLLOWED BY SEVEN NUMERIC DIGITS INDICATING THE SEQUENTIAL ASSIGNMENT NUMBER OF THE CERTIFICATE OF TITLE ISSUED FOR THE VEHICLE.

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SECTION 5. Effective date - applicability. (1) This act shall take effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly that is allowed for submitting a referendum petition pursuant to article V, section 1 (3) of the state constitution; except that, if a referendum petition is filed against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part, if approved by the people, shall take effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by proclamation of the governor.

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(2) The provisions of this act shall apply to applications for certificates of title that are made on or after the applicable effective date of this act.".
