37 Page 9, line 14, strike "BARRED" and substitute "PROHIBITED".

39 Page 12, strike lines 25 and 26 and substitute the following:

41 "(c) "SECURITIES" SHALL HAVE THE SAME MEANING AS SET FORTH
42 IN SECTION 11-51-201 (17)".

44 Page 15, strike lines 22 through 27 and substitute the following:

46 "**SECTION 8. Effective date - applicability.** This act shall take
47 effect upon passage, and shall apply to activities regulated under the
48 "Colorado Trust Company Act" occurring on or after said date.

50 **SECTION 9. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
51 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
52 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety."
