39 WHEREAS, Pursuant to section 37-95-107.8 (4) (b), Colorado  
40 Revised Statutes, the Division of Administration in the Department of  
41 Public Health and Environment, in conjunction with the State Board of  
42 Health, has proposed additions and modifications to the Drinking Water  
43 Project Eligibility List; and

44  
45 WHEREAS, The provision of financial assistance from the  
46 Drinking Water Revolving Fund to the proposed projects will preserve,  
47 protect, conserve, and develop the water resources of the state; promote  
48 the beneficial use of the waters of the state and the protection and  
49 preservation of the public health, safety, and welfare; create and preserve  
50 jobs and employment opportunities; and improve the economic welfare  
51 of the people of the state; and

53 WHEREAS, The General Assembly deems the projects to be in  
54 the interest and to the advantage of the people of the state; now,

8 WHEREAS, Hunting and fishing, in addition to being essential  
9 components of Colorado's rich heritage, enjoy widespread popularity in  
10 this state, with about one-fifth of Coloradans surveyed participating in  
11 hunting and about one-half of Coloradans surveyed participating in  
12 fishing; and

13

14 WHEREAS, Hunting, fishing, and related outdoor activities are a  
15 tremendous boon to Colorado's economy, as more than \$1.7 billion is  
16 spent on hunting and fishing activities alone in this state each year; and

17

18 WHEREAS, The dollars spent by sportsmen also play a critical  
19 and unsung role in maintaining sound wildlife management and  
20 environmental conservation practices in the United States, considering  
21 that:

22

- 23 ● For every taxpayer dollar invested in wildlife conservation,  
24 sportsmen contribute \$9;
- 25 ● Each day, sportsmen contribute more than \$3 million to  
26 wildlife conservation efforts nationally, amounting to more  
27 than \$1.5 billion annually;
- 28 ● In Colorado, sales of hunting and fishing licenses bring in  
29 about \$55 million for the Division of Wildlife each year,  
30 representing about two-thirds of the agency's total revenue;
- 31 ● The Division of Wildlife and its programs are funded  
32 without any state taxpayer contribution whatsoever; and

33

34 WHEREAS, Along with the money generated by their activities,  
35 sportsmen provide direct assistance in maintaining sound wildlife  
36 management and environmental conservation practices by assisting  
37 wildlife managers and enforcement officers at all levels of government,  
38 by providing incentives for the conservation of wildlife and the habitats  
39 and ecosystems on which wildlife depends, and by performing the  
40 essential function of helping to maintain healthy and sustainable wildlife  
41 numbers; and

43 WHEREAS, The stated mission of the Colorado Legislative  
44 Sportsmen's Caucus, a nonpartisan caucus recently formed by the  
45 Sixty-third General Assembly, is:

- 47 ● To preserve and promote the traditional rights of American  
48 citizens to hunt, fish, and pursue outdoor activities;
- 49 ● To ensure that America's sportsmen and women have  
50 reasonable access to public lands to enjoy outdoor pursuits;

52 fisheries management by safeguarding the integrity of  
53 user-fee trust funds;
