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INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTIONS

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The following resolutions were read by title and laid over until later in the day:

HJR02-1079 by Representative(s) Dean; also Senator(s) Entz--
Concerning employer support of the National Guard and Reserve.

WHEREAS, The National Guard and Reserve is essential to the strength of our nation and the well-being of our communities; and

WHEREAS, Since the terrorist attacks on the United States and the onset of Operation "Enduring Freedom", thousands of National Guard and Reserve troops have been activated; and

WHEREAS, The patriotic men and women of the National Guard and Reserve serve voluntarily in an honorable and vital profession, train to respond to their community and their country in time of need, and deserve the support of every segment of our society; and

WHEREAS, If these volunteer forces are to continue serving our nation, increased public understanding is required of the essential role of the National Guard and Reserve in preserving our national security; and

WHEREAS, The members of the National Guard and Reserve must have the cooperation of all American employers in encouraging employee participation in National Guard and Reserve training programs; and

WHEREAS, Employers across the country are signing "Statements of Support" to demonstrate their commitment to employees who are members of the National Guard and Reserve; now, therefore,

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Sixty-third General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the Senate concurring herein:

That we, the members of the Sixty-third General Assembly, encourage employers in Colorado to support members of the National Guard and Reserve by pledging that:

(1) Employment will not be denied because of service in the National Guard and Reserve;

(2) Employee job and career opportunities will not be limited or reduced because of service in the National Guard and Reserve; and

(3) Employees will be granted leaves of absence for military training in the National Guard and Reserve, consistent with existing laws, without sacrifice of annual or vacation leave.

Be It Further Resolved, That a copy of this Joint Resolution be sent to Fred Fletemeyer, Chairman, Colorado Committee for Employer Support of the Guard and Reserve.

15 WHEREAS, The lynx reintroduction program has been a
16 collaborative effort between the State of Colorado, the U.S. Fish and
17 Wildlife Service, the U.S. Forest Service, ski resorts, recreationalists,
18 farmers, and ranchers; and

20 WHEREAS, The success and value of the lynx reintroduction
21 program needs more time before it can be accurately evaluated; and
22

23 WHEREAS, The State of Colorado seeks the time and flexibility
24 provided in Section 10 (j) of the Endangered Species Act, which allows
25 for the "experimental, nonessential" designation of a species for
26 reintroduction and recovery purposes; and
27

28 WHEREAS, Such designation under Section 10 (j) of the
29 Endangered Species Act would protect Colorado's ability to continue the
30 lynx recovery effort by ensuring regulatory flexibility so that animals
31 reintroduced into the state are not used against our citizens; now,
32 therefore,

34 *Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Sixty-third*
35 *General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the Senate concurring*
36 *herein:*

38 That we, the members of the Sixty-third General Assembly, urge
39 the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to grant "experimental, nonessential"
40 designation to the lynx population in Colorado for reintroduction and
41 recovery purposes.
