2 10-16-104 (5), 10-16-104 (5.5) (a) (I) and (8) (b), the introductory  
3 portions to 10-16-104 (9) (a) and (12) (a), and 10-16-104 (14) (a),  
4 Colorado Revised Statutes, are amended to read:

6           **10-16-104. Mandatory coverage provisions. (1.7) Therapies**  
7 **for congenital defects and birth abnormalities.** (a) After the first  
8 thirty-one days of life, policy limitations and exclusions that are generally  
9 applicable under the policy may apply; except that all individual and  
10 group health benefit plans, NOT INCLUDING BASIC HEALTH BENEFIT PLANS  
11 OFFERED PURSUANT TO SECTION 10-16-105 (7.2) (b) (I) (A) OR (7.2) (b) (I)  
12 (B), shall provide medically necessary physical, occupational, and speech  
13 therapy for the care and treatment of congenital defects and birth  
14 abnormalities for covered children up to five years of age.

15  
16           (5) **Mental illness.** Every group policy or contract providing  
17 hospitalization or medical benefits by an entity subject to the provisions  
18 of part 2 or 3 of this article, EXCEPT BASIC HEALTH BENEFIT PLANS  
19 OFFERED PURSUANT TO SECTION 10-16-105 (7.2) (b) (I) (A) OR (7.2) (c) (I)  
20 (A), shall provide benefits for conditions arising from mental illness at  
21 least equal to the following:

22  
23           (5.5) **Biologically based mental illness.** (a) (I) Every group  
24 policy, plan certificate, and contract of a carrier subject to the provisions  
25 of part 2, 3, or 4 of this article, except BASIC HEALTH BENEFIT PLANS  
26 OFFERED PURSUANT TO SECTION 10-16-105 (7.2) (b) (I) (A) AND (7.2) (c)  
27 (I) (A) AND those described in section 10-16-102 (21) (b), shall provide  
28 coverage for the treatment of biologically based mental illness that is no  
29 less extensive than the coverage provided for any other physical illness.  
30 Any preauthorization or utilization review mechanism used in the  
31 determination to provide such coverage shall be the same as, or no more  
32 restrictive than, that used in the determination to provide coverage for any  
33 other physical illness. The commissioner shall adopt such rules as are  
34 necessary to carry out the provisions of this subsection (5.5). In  
35 promulgating such rules, the commissioner shall recognize that the  
36 substance of the mechanisms for preauthorization or utilization review  
37 may differ between medical specialties and that such mechanisms shall  
38 not be more restrictive with respect to a covered person or a mental health  
39 provider for a determination under this subparagraph (I) than for any  
40 other physical illness.

41  
42           (8) **Availability of hospice care coverage.** (b) Notwithstanding  
43 any other provision of the law to the contrary, no individual or group  
44 policy of sickness and accident insurance issued by an insurer subject to  
45 the provisions of part 2 of this article and no plan issued by an entity  
46 subject to the provisions of part 3 of this article which provides hospital,  
47 surgical, or major medical coverage on an expense incurred basis, EXCEPT  
48 BASIC HEALTH BENEFIT PLANS OFFERED PURSUANT TO SECTION 10-16-105  
49 (7.2) (b) (I) (A) OR (7.2) (c) (I) (A), shall be sold in this state unless a  
50 policyholder under such policy or plan is offered the opportunity to  
51 purchase coverage for benefits for the costs of home health services and  
52 hospice care which have been recommended by a physician as medically  
53 necessary. Nothing in this paragraph (b) shall require an insurer to offer  
54 coverages for which premiums would not cover expected benefits. This  
55 paragraph (b) shall not apply to any insurance policy, plan, contract, or  
56 certificate which provides coverage exclusively for disability loss of

1 income, dental services, optical services, hospital confinement indemnity,  
2 accident only, or prescription drug services.

3  
4 **(9) Availability of coverage for alcoholism.** (a) Any other  
5 provision of law to the contrary notwithstanding, no hospitalization or  
6 medical benefits contract on a group basis issued by an insurer subject to  
7 the provisions of part 2 of this article or an entity subject to the provisions  
8 of part 3 of this article, EXCEPT BASIC HEALTH BENEFIT PLANS OFFERED  
9 PURSUANT TO SECTION 10-16-105 (7.2) (b) (I) (A) OR (7.2) (c) (I) (A), shall  
10 be sold in this state unless the policyholder under such contract or  
11 persons holding the master contract under such contract are offered the  
12 opportunity to purchase coverage for benefits for the treatment of and for  
13 conditions arising from alcoholism, which benefits are at least equal to  
14 the following minimum requirements:

15  
16 **(12) Hospitalization and general anesthesia for dental**  
17 **procedures for dependent children.** (a) All individual and all group  
18 sickness and accident insurance policies that are delivered or issued for  
19 delivery within the state by an entity subject to the provisions of part 2 of  
20 this article and all individual and group health care service or indemnity  
21 contracts issued by an entity subject to the provisions of part 3 or 4 of this  
22 article, except BASIC HEALTH BENEFIT PLANS OFFERED PURSUANT TO  
23 SECTION 10-16-105 (7.2) (b) (I) (A) AND (7.2) (c) (I) (A) AND supplemental  
24 policies that cover a specific disease or other limited benefit, shall  
25 provide coverages for general anesthesia, when rendered in a hospital,  
26 outpatient surgical facility, or other facility licensed pursuant to section  
27 25-3-101, C.R.S., and for associated hospital or facility charges for dental  
28 care provided to a dependent child, as dependent is defined in section  
29 10-16-102 (14), of a covered person. Such dependent child shall, in the  
30 treating dentist's opinion, satisfy one or more of the following criteria:

31  
32 **(14) Prosthetic devices.** (a) Any health benefit plan, except  
33 BASIC HEALTH BENEFIT PLANS OFFERED PURSUANT TO SECTION 10-16-105  
34 (7.2) (b) (I) (A) AND (7.2) (c) (I) (A) AND supplemental policies covering  
35 a specified disease or other limited benefit, that provides hospital,  
36 surgical, or medical expense insurance shall provide coverage for benefits  
37 for prosthetic devices that equal those benefits provided for under federal  
38 laws for health insurance for the aged and disabled pursuant to 42 U.S.C.  
39 secs. 1395k, 1395l, and 1395m and 42 CFR 414.202, 414.210, 414.228,  
40 and 410.100, as applicable to this subsection (14).

41  
42 **SECTION 2.** 10-16-105 (7.2) and (7.3) (a), Colorado Revised  
43 Statutes, are amended to read:

44  
45 **10-16-105. Small group sickness and accident insurance -**  
46 **guaranteed issue - mandated provisions for basic and standard health**  
47 **benefit plans.** (7.2) The commissioner shall promulgate rules to  
48 implement a basic health benefit plan and a standard health benefit plan  
49 to be offered by each small employer carrier as a condition of transacting  
50 business in this state. Such rules shall be effective January 1, 1995, and  
51 in conformity with the provisions of article 4 of title 24, C.R.S., AND  
52 SHALL INCLUDE, WITHOUT LIMITATION, THE FOLLOWING FEATURES:

54 (a) THE STANDARD HEALTH BENEFIT PLAN SHALL REFLECT THE  
55 BENEFIT DESIGN OF COMMON PLAN OFFERINGS IN THE SMALL GROUP

9 (B) CATASTROPHIC COVERAGE AS DEFINED IN SECTION 10-16-116;

11 (C) A HEALTH BENEFIT PLAN IN WHICH THE COVERED PERSON IS  
12 RESPONSIBLE FOR A DEDUCTIBLE AMOUNT OF ONE THOUSAND FIVE  
13 HUNDRED DOLLARS AFTER THE FIRST ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS OF  
14 COVERAGE AS PROVIDED BY AN EMPLOYER IN A MANNER SIMILAR TO A  
15 PERSONAL CARE ACCOUNT;  
16

17 (D) A BASIC HEALTH BENEFIT PLAN AS DETERMINED BY RULE BY  
18 THE COMMISSIONER.  
19

20 (II) A BASIC HEALTH BENEFIT PLAN DESIGN ISSUED PURSUANT TO  
21 SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH (b) MAY BE OFFERED IN  
22 CONJUNCTION WITH A MEDICAL SAVINGS ACCOUNT.

24 (c) (I) THE BASIC HEALTH BENEFIT PLAN OFFERED BY A HEALTH  
25 MAINTENANCE ORGANIZATION SHALL REFLECT AT LEAST ONE OF THE  
26 FOLLOWING BENEFIT DESIGNS:

28 (A) CATASTROPHIC COVERAGE AS DEFINED IN SECTION 10-16-116

49 (d) A SMALL EMPLOYER CARRIER OR A HEALTH MAINTENANCE  
50 ORGANIZATION OFFERING THE COVERAGES AUTHORIZED IN PARAGRAPHS  
51 (b) AND (c) OF THIS SUBSECTION (7.2) SHALL DEMONSTRATE IN RATE  
52 FILINGS SUBMITTED TO THE COMMISSIONER THE SAVINGS TO THE INSURED  
53 TO BE REALIZED UNDER THE DIFFERENT BASIC PLANS. A DISCLOSURE FORM  
54 FOR A BASIC HEALTH BENEFIT PLAN FOR A SMALL EMPLOYER SHALL  
55 INCLUDE, IN TYPE OF AT LEAST TWELVE-POINT SIZE, WHAT THE  
56 APPROXIMATE COST SAVINGS WILL BE IF A SPECIFIC BASIC HEALTH BENEFIT

 3 (7.3) (a) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection (7.3),  
 4 effective January 1, ~~1995~~ 2003, every small employer carrier OFFERING  
 5 A MANAGED CARE PLAN shall, as a condition of transacting business in this  
 6 state with small employers, actively offer to such small employers the  
 7 choice of a TWO OF THE basic health benefit plan PLANS ESTABLISHED BY  
 8 PARAGRAPH (b) OF SUBSECTION (7.2) OF THIS SECTION ~~or~~ AND a standard

 19 to a health benefit plan offered by a carrier if such plan is made available  
 20 in the small group market only through one or more bona fide association  
 21 plans and except as provided in paragraph (i) of this subsection (7.3).
