**TITLE:** CONCERNING RESTRICTIONS ON CREDIT CARD RECEIPTS.**Summary of Assessment**

This bill prohibits retailers and other businesses that accept credit card payments from displaying more than the last five digits of the credit card account number and the credit card's expiration date on any electronically printed receipt. The bill applies to any business formed after the effective date of the act that uses cash registers or other devices to electronically print credit card receipts. After January 1, 2003, the bill applies to all businesses using cash registers or other devices that electronically print credit card receipts. The bill is effective following the 90-day period after the final adjournment of the General Assembly that is allowed for filing referendum petitions.

The bill is assessed as having no state or local fiscal impact. While the bill will effect retailers and other businesses, there is no fiscal impact to the state.
