48 The following resolution was read by title and laid over one day under the  
49 rules:

53 Hefley, Jahn, Johnson R., King, McFadyen, Ragsdale,  
54 Salazar, Sinclair, Spence, Spradley, Stafford--Concerning  
55 the naming of a portion of State Highway 115 as the  
56 "Vietnam Veterans Memorial Highway".



1           WHEREAS, Members of the Armed Forces of the United States  
2 stationed in Southeast Asia during the Vietnam campaign served our  
3 nation under the most trying conditions at a time when the nation was  
4 divided in its support; and

5  
6           WHEREAS, Over 300,000 soldiers were wounded and more than  
7 75,000 severely disabled during the Vietnam campaign; and

8  
9           WHEREAS, More than 58,000 Americans gave their lives for the  
10 cause of freedom in Vietnam, and of these 58,000, more than 600 were  
11 from Colorado; and

12  
13           WHEREAS, In 1982, the national monument to those who died in  
14 Vietnam, known as "The Wall", was inscribed with the names of all  
15 military personnel killed during the Vietnam campaign and is regularly  
16 visited by more than 2.5 million people each year; and

17  
18           WHEREAS, Our veterans have answered the call to fight for  
19 freedom in both popular and unpopular wars, in conflicts where the side  
20 of freedom clearly prevailed and in some where victory was denied; and

21  
22           WHEREAS, Our nation's Vietnam veterans fought with courage  
23 and honor, risking their lives to protect the American values of freedom  
24 and democracy; and

25  
26           WHEREAS, While veterans of previous military campaigns were  
27 welcomed home with respect and adoration, Vietnam veterans received  
28 no heroes' welcome, yet their service was no less heroic, their actions no  
29 less courageous, and their wounds, both physical and emotional, no less  
30 painful; and

31  
32           WHEREAS, The impact of that campaign continues today in the  
33 families whose sons and daughters were killed, in the wounds that have  
34 never healed, in the lives that were changed forever, and for the prisoners  
35 of war and those still missing in action; and

36  
37           WHEREAS, Vietnam veterans endured the hardships of war and  
38 faced serious challenges of re-entry and acceptance upon their return  
39 from overseas and despite the challenges and rejection, the vast majority  
40 of Vietnam-era veterans continued on with their lives to become  
41 successful, productive members of society and good citizens; and

42  
43           WHEREAS, Since their return, these veterans have made  
44 tremendous contributions to their communities, states, and nation in an  
45 effort to advance the American ideals and goals for which they fought;  
46 and

47  
48           WHEREAS, We as citizens of the great State of Colorado must  
49 never forget the pain and suffering that lingers today for the men and  
50 women who fought, with honor and distinction, in the name of freedom  
51 and democracy for all; and

52  
53           WHEREAS, Although our nation was divided in its support of  
54 Vietnam, we must pledge to never forget the outstanding strength,  
55 service, and sacrifice of those who fought to defend democracy, human  
56 dignity, and the right to self-determination; now, therefore,

1 *Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Sixty-fourth*  
2 *General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the Senate concurring*  
3 *herein:*

4  
5 (1) That the portion of State Highway 115 that runs along the west  
6 side of Fort Carson, beginning at the southern El Paso County border and  
7 continuing north to South Nevada Avenue in Colorado Springs, shall be  
8 named the "Vietnam Veterans Memorial Highway" in honor of the men  
9 and women who served in Vietnam.

10  
11 (2) That the Colorado Department of Transportation may accept  
12 and expend gifts, grants, donations, and federal funds for the purposes of  
13 the initial placement of signs to mark the designated section of State  
14 Highway 115 as the "Vietnam Veterans Memorial Highway".

15  
16 (3) That two signs mark the designated section of State Highway  
17 115.

18  
19 (4) That the Colorado Department of Transportation may explore  
20 a cooperative agreement with the Commissioners of El Paso County for  
21 the maintenance of the markings for the "Vietnam Veterans Memorial  
22 Highway".

23  
24 *Be It Further Resolved,* That copies of this Joint Resolution be  
25 sent to Major General Robert Wilson, Commanding Officer of Fort  
26 Carson, Donald Smith, District Commander of the VFW, Jack Artman,
