 44 provide financial assistance for wastewater treatment system projects as
 45 set forth in section 37-95-107.6, Colorado Revised Statutes, and in
 46 accordance with the terms and conditions of the federal "Clean Water
 47 Act"; and
 48

49 WHEREAS, Pursuant to section 37-95-107.6 (4) (c), Colorado
 50 Revised Statutes, in order to qualify as wastewater treatment system
 51 projects eligible for assistance from the Authority through the Water
 52 Pollution Control Revolving Fund or otherwise, proposed projects must
 53 be included on a Project Eligibility List; and
 54

55 WHEREAS, Pursuant to section 37-95-107.6 (4) (b), Colorado
 56 Revised Statutes, annual additions or modifications to the Project

1 Eligibility List are required to be approved by Joint Resolution of the
2 Colorado General Assembly, signed by the Governor; and

3
4 WHEREAS, The Colorado Water Quality Control Commission
5 has developed additions and modifications to the Project Eligibility List
6 consisting of proposed wastewater treatment system projects that have
7 been identified by the Authority, in conjunction with the Colorado
8 Department of Public Health and Environment, acting through the
9 Colorado Water Quality Control Division, and the Colorado Department
10 of Local Affairs, acting through the Colorado Division of Local
11 Government, as appropriate for inclusion as additions or modifications to
12 the Project Eligibility List; and

14 WHEREAS, The provision of financial assistance from the
15 Authority through the Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund or
16 otherwise to the proposed projects will preserve, protect, conserve, and
17 develop the water resources of the state; promote the beneficial use of the
18 waters of the state and the protection and preservation of the public health,
19 safety, and welfare; create and preserve jobs and employment
20 opportunities; and improve the economic welfare of the people of the
