WHEREAS, Effective child abuse prevention programs succeed when partnerships are created between and among government and social

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service agencies, schools, religious and civic organizations, law enforcement agencies, health care providers, the media, the business community, and especially parents themselves; and

WHEREAS, All citizens must work to prevent child abuse within their community by becoming aware of the problem of child abuse and its negative impacts, by working to protect children, and by giving parents the support they need to raise their children in a safe, nurturing environment; now, therefore,

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Sixty-fourth General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the Senate concurring herein:

- 1) That we, the members of the Sixty-fourth General Assembly, proclaim the month of April, 2003, Child Abuse Prevention Month in the State of Colorado.
- 2) That each individual has a responsibility to perform some positive act each day on behalf of children.
- 3) That the General Assembly calls upon all citizens, community and religious organizations, businesses, and government agencies to create alliances and increase their efforts to prevent child abuse, thereby strengthening the communities of this state.

Be It Further Resolved, That copies of this Joint Resolution be sent to Governor Bill Owens and Lieutenant Governor Jane Norton.

WHEREAS, The Denver Veterans Affairs Medical Center's primary service area includes metropolitan Denver and twenty-five contiguous counties in Colorado and western Nebraska, the veteran population in the service area being more than four hundred thousand; and

WHEREAS, The Denver Veterans Affairs Medical Center is an active teaching and biomedical research center affiliated with the University of Colorado Schools of Dentistry, Medicine, Nursing, and Pharmacy and the University of Colorado Hospital; and

WHEREAS, The Denver Veterans Affairs Medical Center supports more than one hundred medical resident positions in thirty-eight training programs and provides clinical training rotations for
