- (I) Acquire and hold property for the use of Metropolitan state college of Denver;
 - (II) Be a party to all suits and contracts; and
- (III) Do all things necessary to carry out the provisions of this article in like manner as municipal corporations of this state, including but not limited to the power to demand, receive, hold, and use for the best interests of Metropolitan state college of Denver such money, lands, or other property as may be donated or devised to or for the college.
- (2) The governor shall appoint, with the consent of the senate, seven NINE members of the board of trustees. The members first appointed to said board shall take office on July 1, 2002. The terms of appointed members of the board of trustees shall be four years; except that, of the members first appointed, the governor shall select two members who shall serve one-year terms, two members who shall serve two-year terms, and three FIVE members who shall serve four-year terms. All appointed members shall serve until their successors are appointed and qualified.
- (3) A full-time junior or senior student at Metropolitan state college of Denver, elected by the student body at large, shall fill the eighth TENTH office as a member of the board of trustees. The term of said office shall be one year, beginning July 1, 2002, and beginning July 1 each year thereafter. The elected student office shall be advisory, without the right to vote and without the right to attend executive sessions of the board of trustees, as provided by section 24-6-402, C.R.S. The elected student member of the board of trustees shall have resided in the state of Colorado not fewer than three years immediately prior to election. As used in this subsection (3), "full-time student" shall have the same definition as "full-time equivalent student" used by the joint budget committee of the general assembly.
- (4) A full-time member of the teaching faculty at large of Metropolitan state college of Denver, elected by the faculty at large, shall fill the ninth ELEVENTH office as a member of the board of trustees. The term of said office shall be one year, beginning July 1, 2002, and beginning July 1 each year thereafter. The elected faculty member of the board of trustees shall have the right to vote but shall be ADVISORY, without the right to VOTE AND WITHOUT THE RIGHT TO attend executive sessions of the board of trustees, as provided by section 24-6-402, C.R.S.".

(4) (a) Any person who violates the provisions of subsection (1), (2), or (3) of this section commits a class 1 misdemeanor traffic offense. The minimum fine imposed by section 42-4-1701 (3) (a) (II) (A) shall be mandatory, and the court shall not suspend such minimum fine, in whole or in part, unless it is established that appropriate insurance as required under sections 10-4-705 and 10-4-716, C.R.S., BY LAW has been

obtained. Nothing in this paragraph (a) shall be construed to prevent the court from imposing a fine greater than the minimum mandatory fine.

- (b) Upon a second or subsequent conviction under this section within a period of two years following a prior conviction under this section, in addition to any imprisonment imposed pursuant to section 42-4-1701 (3) (a) (II) (A), the defendant shall be punished by a minimum mandatory fine of not less than two hundred dollars, and the court shall not suspend such minimum fine, in whole or in part, unless it is established that appropriate insurance as required under sections 10-4-705 and 10-4-716, C.R.S., BY LAW has been obtained. Nothing in this paragraph (b) shall be construed to prevent the court from imposing a fine greater than the minimum mandatory fine.
- (c) In addition to the penalties prescribed in paragraphs (a) and (b) of this subsection (4), any person convicted pursuant to this section may, at the discretion of the court, be sentenced to perform not less than forty hours of community service, subject to the provisions of section 18-1.3-507, C.R.S.
- (5) Testimony of the failure of any owner or operator of a motor vehicle to present immediate evidence of a complying policy or certificate of self-insurance in full force and effect as required by sections 10-4-705 and 10-4-716, C.R.S. LAW, when requested to do so by a peace officer, shall constitute prima facie evidence, at a trial concerning a violation charged under subsection (1) or (2) of this section, that such owner or operator of a motor vehicle violated subsection (1) or (2) of this section.
- (6) No person charged with violating subsection (1), (2), or (3) of this section shall be convicted if the person produces in court a bona fide complying policy or certificate of self-insurance which THAT was in full force and effect as required by sections 10-4-705 and 10-4-716, C.R.S., LAW at the time of the alleged violation.
- (8) This section is repealed, effective July 1, 2003, unless the review conducted by the department of regulatory agencies pursuant to section 42-7-608 and reported to the general assembly indicates that the proportion of uninsured motorists declined between July 1, 2000, and the date of the department's review.";
