"FUNERAL DIRECTOR OR EMBALMER HAS GIVEN CLEAR PRIOR NOTICE OF THIS PROVISION AND HAS GIVEN SUCH PERSON A REASONABLE OPPORTUNITY TO COLLECT THE CREMATED REMAINS, IF THE FUNERAL DIRECTOR OR EMBALMER RECORDS THE EXACT LOCATION OF THE DISPOSITION AND THE COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE DISPOSITION AND THE RECOVERY OF THE CREMATED REMAINS IS POSSIBLE. RECOVERY OF COSTS SHALL BE LIMITED TO A REASONABLE AMOUNT OF THE COSTS ACTUALLY EXPENDED BY THE FUNERAL DIRECTOR OR EMBALMER."

In no case shall a person's inability to pay be the basis for not providing treatment by any medical personnel MEDICAL TREATMENT EQUIVALENT TO THE COMMUNITY STANDARD OF CARE. Any medical treatment charge that remains unpaid shall constitute a cost of care that the person may be ordered to pay pursuant to section 18-1.3-701, C.R.S., and that may be collected by the county pursuant to the provisions of section 16-11-101.6, C.R.S.
- (2) The provisions of this section shall apply to any person held in custody in a county jail regardless of whether the person is a juvenile, is being held prior to trial, or is in custody for conviction under a state statute or a county or municipal ordinance.
- (3) When a person is held in custody in a county jail, the person shall be primarily responsible for the payment of the cost of medical care provided to the person for a self-inflicted injury or a condition that was preexisting prior to the person's arrest and shall be charged for the medical care by the

PROVIDER OF CARE. FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, "PREEXISTING CONDITION" MEANS AN ILLNESS BEGINNING OR AN INJURY SUSTAINED BEFORE A PERSON IS IN THE PEACEABLE CUSTODY OF THE COUNTY'S OFFICERS. THIS SUBSECTION (3) SHALL NOT APPLY TO CARE REQUIRED BY THE COUNTY JAIL PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS SECTION, CARE PAID FOR BY OTHER ENTITIES PURSUANT TO SECTION 17-26-120 OR 17 26-124, OR CARE PAID FOR BY ANY OTHER ENTITY.

(4) A COUNTY MAY SEEK PAYMENT OR REIMBURSEMENT FOR ANY MEDICAL TREATMENT COSTS FROM A PERSON BEING HELD IN CUSTODY AND RECEIVING SUCH SERVICES.

SECTION 2. Effective date. This act shall take effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly that is allowed for submitting a referendum petition pursuant to article V, section 1 (3) of the state constitution; except that, if a referendum petition is filed against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part, if approved by the people, shall take effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by proclamation of the governor.".
