**SECTION 2.** Appropriation. (1) In addition to any other appropriation, there is hereby appropriated, out of any moneys collected pursuant to section 12-6-104 (4) (a), Colorado Revised Statutes, to the department of public safety for allocation to the Colorado bureau of investigation, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, the sum of two hundred fifty thousand three hundred and thirty-one dollars (\$250,331) and 0.4 FTE, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the implementation of this act. Of said sum, ninety-five thousand three hundred and nineteen dollars (\$95,319) shall be from fees generated from criminal background checks, and one hundred fifty-five thousand twelve dollars (\$155,012) shall be from cash funds exempt.

(2) In addition to any other appropriation, there is hereby appropriated, out of any moneys in the auto dealers license fund, created in section 12-6-123, Colorado Revised Statutes, to the department of revenue, for allocation to the information technology division, for fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, the sum of twenty-six thousand four hundred dollars (\$26,400), or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the implementation of this act.".
