- (c) FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SUBSECTION (4), "APPLICANT FOR AN ORIGINAL LICENSE" MEANS:
- (I) ANY APPLICANT WHO IS APPLYING FOR A LICENSE FOR THE FIRST TIME;
- (II) ANY APPLICANT WHOSE PREVIOUS LICENSE HAD BEEN DENIED, SUSPENDED, REVOKED, OR HAD EXPIRED;
- (III) ANY APPLICANT WHO HAD VOLUNTARILY SURRENDERED HIS OR HER LICENSE OR WHO HAD ABANDONED HIS OR HER PRINCIPAL PLACE OF BUSINESS FOR MORE THAN THIRTY DAYS; AND
- (IV) ANY APPLICANT WHO IS APPLYING FOR A CHANGE OF ENTITY OR A CHANGE OF OWNERSHIP.".

- "(6) (a) In any claim alleging a construction defect, a claimant may recover only actual damages and shall in no circumstances recover damages that may otherwise be awarded under the provisions of the "Colorado Consumer Protection Act", article 1 of title 6, C.R.S., or damages for noneconomic loss or injury, as defined in section 13-21-102.5; except that a claimant may recover such damages under the provisions of the "Colorado Consumer Protection Act" if a judge or arbitrator finds beyond a reasonable doubt in an evidentiary hearing held prior to a jury's determination of any issue relating to liability or damages that a construction professional acted fraudulently and in bad faith in the construction of improvements to real property and that such conduct resulted in property loss or damage.
- (b) (I) FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SUBSECTION (6), "ACTUAL DAMAGES" MEANS ECONOMIC DAMAGES CAUSED BY A CONSTRUCTION DEFECT, RELOCATION COSTS, AND INTEREST AND SUCH COSTS OF SUIT AND REASONABLE ATTORNEY FEES AS MAY BE AWARDABLE PURSUANT TO CONTRACT OR APPLICABLE LAW.
- (II) FOR PURPOSES OF THIS PARAGRAPH (b), "ECONOMIC DAMAGES" MEANS THE DIMINUTION IN VALUE OF REAL PROPERTY AS A RESULT OF AN ALLEGED CONSTRUCTION DEFECT OR THE REASONABLE COST TO REPAIR THE ALLEGED CONSTRUCTION DEFECT, WHICHEVER IS LESS.
- (c) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraphs (a) and (b) of this subsection (6), in any claim alleging a construction defect, a claimant may claim damages for expenses incurred and income lost as a result of personal injury or death caused by the construction defect and, subject to the limitations set forth in sections 13-21-102.5 and 13-21-203, may also claim damages for noneconomic loss or injury that results from personal injury or death caused by the construction defect."

Page 10, after line 18, insert the following:

- "(8) EXCEPT FOR THE PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTION (6) OF THIS SECTION, THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION SHALL NOT APPLY TO CLAIMS BY PUBLIC UTILITIES FOR LOSSES RELATED TO CONSTRUCTION DEFECTS.".
- Page 11, line 2, strike "AN IMMINENT" and substitute "A".
- Page 13, after line 8, insert the following:
- "13-20-808. Inapplicability to governments. (1) The Provisions of this part 8 shall not apply to claims by Governments for losses related to construction defects.
- (2) FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION "GOVERNMENT" MEANS THE STATE, A CITY, COUNTY, CITY AND COUNTY, SCHOOL DISTRICT, OR SPECIAL DISTRICT.".
