"12-60-602. Simulcast facilities and simulcast races - unlawful act - repeal. (5) (a) (I) An in-state simulcast facility THAT IS NOT LOCATED ON THE PREMISES OF A GREYHOUND TRACK THAT IS CURRENTLY CONDUCTING A RACE MEET OF AT LEAST NINETY LIVE RACE DAYS may receive only special event UP TO A TOTAL OF ONE HUNDRED TWENTY DAYS OF SIMULCAST greyhound races from an out-of-state host track and, in addition, WHILE THE LIVE RACE MEET IS ACTIVE. SUCH TOTAL INCLUDES, AND IS NOT IN ADDITION TO, THE DAYS ON WHICH LIVE RACING IS HELD.

- (II) On any day on which an in-state simulcast facility receives greyhound simulcast races from an out-of-state host track and on which one or more in-state host tracks are running live greyhound races, such in-state simulcast facility shall receive and conduct pari-mutuel wagering on the broadcast signal of simulcast greyhound races from at least one such CONDUCTED AT THE in-state host track TRACKS, if such broadcast signal is made available to it on usual and customary terms and conditions, including price. The commission shall approve no more than fifteen special events per year.
- (III) AN IN-STATE SIMULCAST FACILITY THAT IS NOT LOCATED ON THE PREMISES OF A GREYHOUND TRACK CONDUCTING A RACE MEET OF AT LEAST NINETY LIVE RACE DAYS MAY ONLY RECEIVE A BROADCAST SIGNAL OF SIMULCAST GREYHOUND RACES AND CONDUCT PARI-MUTUEL WAGERING ON THE BROADCAST SIGNAL OF SUCH GREYHOUND RACES CONDUCTED AT AN OUT-OF-STATE HOST TRACK THROUGH AN IN-STATE SIMULCAST FACILITY THAT IS LOCATED ON THE PREMISES OF A GREYHOUND TRACK CONDUCTING A RACE MEET OF AT LEAST NINETY LIVE RACE DAYS. IF MORE THAN ONE GREYHOUND TRACK IS CONDUCTING A LIVE RACE MEET OF AT LEAST NINETY DAYS CONCURRENTLY, AN IN-STATE SIMULCAST FACILITY MAY ONLY RECEIVE THE BROADCAST SIGNAL FROM AN OUT-OF-STATE HOST TRACK AND CONDUCT PARI-MUTUEL WAGERING ON SUCH SIGNAL THROUGH AN IN-STATE SIMULCAST FACILITY LOCATED ON THE PREMISES OF A GREYHOUND TRACK IN THE SAME CIRCUIT AS THE IN-STATE SIMULCAST FACILITY.
- (IV) FIVE PERCENT OF THE GROSS RECEIPTS FROM PARI-MUTUEL WAGERS PLACED AT AN IN-STATE SIMULCAST FACILITY ON SIMULCAST GREYHOUND RACES SHALL BE DEPOSITED INTO THE PURSE FUND AT THE TRACK HOSTING THE CURRENT LIVE GREYHOUND MEET THROUGH WHICH IT RECEIVES THE BROADCAST SIGNAL AND DISTRIBUTED CONSISTENTLY WITH SECTION 12-60-702 (1) (d.5), (1) (e) (I), and (1) (e) (II).";

strike lines 26 and 27 and substitute the following:

"SECTION 3. Effective date. This act shall take effect June 1, 2003.

- (a) AT THE SAME RATE THAT THE PROVIDER IS REIMBURSED FOR SUCH SERVICES BY THE MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM; OR
- (b) If the provider is not reimbursed by the medical assistance program, at the highest rate that the provider is reimbursed in whole or in part with state moneys in any other program.
- (1.5) (a) IF ECONOMICAL, A COUNTY SHERIFF MAY TRANSPORT A PERSON HELD IN CUSTODY IN A COUNTY JAIL TO THE COLORADO MENTAL HEALTH INSTITUTE AT PUEBLO FOR MEDICAL TREATMENT. WITHIN THE CAPACITY OF THE MEDICAL FACILITY, THE COLORADO";

after line 23, insert the following:

"(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (a) of this subsection (1.5), the mental health institute at Pueblo shall charge a county the actual costs of the medical care provided to a person held in custody. The charges shall cover the full direct and indirect costs of the care provided as determined by generally accepted accounting principles. The general assembly shall include within the appropriation for the general medical division of the institute an amount equal to the estimated reimbursements to be received from counties pursuant to this paragraph (b).";
