INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were read by title and laid over until later in the day:

SJM03-010 by Senator(s) Anderson; also Representative(s) Fairbank--
Concerning memorializing former legislator Claire Traylor.

HJR03-1071 by Representative(s) Spradley, King, Veiga; also
Senator(s) Andrews, Anderson, Fitz-Gerald--Concerning
the authorization of the Committee on Legal Services to
provide further direction to the legal counsel retained by
the General Assembly pursuant to House Joint Resolution
03-1014 that authorized legal proceedings regarding the
Governor's purported vetoes.

WHEREAS, The General Assembly adopted House Joint
Resolution 03-1014 at the First Regular Session of the Sixty-fourth
General Assembly and authorized the Committee on Legal Services to
retain legal counsel to bring a civil action on behalf of the General
Assembly to determine the validity of the purported vetoes of the
headnote definitions of the 2002 long bill contained in House Bill
02-1420 and of the purported veto of the appropriation clause in House
Bill 02-1246; and

WHEREAS, Legal counsel has been retained by the Committee on
Legal Services for purposes of bringing such a civil action; and

WHEREAS, Since the adoption of House Joint Resolution
03-1014, the General Assembly has enacted Senate Bill 03-258 (the 2003
long bill), which contains headnote definitions similar to those contained
in House Bill 02-1420; and

WHEREAS, The General Assembly has enacted substantive law
bills containing appropriation clauses at the First Regular Session of the
Sixty-fourth General Assembly; and

WHEREAS, Based on the purported vetoes of the headnote
definitions in House Bill 02-1420 and the appropriation clause in House
Bill 02-1246, the General Assembly has reason to believe that the
Governor may attempt to veto similar provisions; and

WHEREAS, The authorization to retain counsel for the purpose
of bringing a civil action contained in House Joint Resolution 03-1014
was limited to the purported vetoes of the headnote definitions in House
Bill 02-1420 and the appropriation clause in House Bill 02-1246; and

1 WHEREAS, In order to protect the legislative interests served by
 2 the adoption of House Joint Resolution 03-1014, the Committee on Legal
 3 Services requires permission to direct and authorize counsel to seek
 4 appropriate relief through civil action from later, similar purported vetoes
 5 or purported vetoes of any appropriation footnotes; now, therefore,
 6

7 *Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Sixty-fourth*
 8 *General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the Senate concurring*
 9 *herein:*

 11 That the Committee on Legal Services has authority to direct
 12 counsel to include in the action authorized by House Joint Resolution
 13 03-1014, or any separate civil action, claims related to the purported veto
 14 of any appropriation footnotes and to any purported veto of Senate Bill
 15 03-258 (the 2003 long bill) or of any other bill enacted in a regular or
 16 special session that implicates the legislative interests served by the
 17 adoption of House Joint Resolution 03-1014, until or unless the legal
 18 issues raised by defense of said legislative interests are finally resolved
 19 by judicial decision.

Ladies and Gentlemen:

I am returning to you House Bill 03-1208, "Concerning the Enterprise Zone Tax Benefit Extensions that Taxpayers May Receive for Certain Tax Benefits After Termination of the Enterprise Zone." I vetoed this bill as of 12:34 p.m. today, and this letter sets forth my reasons for doing so.

The enterprise zone program was created by the General Assembly to provide incentives for private enterprise to expand, and for new businesses to locate, in economically depressed rural and urban areas of our state. The objective of providing businesses with private incentives at the expense of public revenues was justified as a means to assist localities in their efforts to overcome conditions of unemployment, underemployment, net out migration, chronic economic distress, and sudden and severe economic dislocations.

I appreciate the hard work of the sponsors of House Bill 03-1208. This

1 bill represents the latest of many good-faith efforts to attempt repairs to
2 a program that suffers from deficiencies. Rather than enact this bill and
3 continue with a piecemeal approach to reform that has for too long
4 hobbled our state's ability to craft a coherent, comprehensive program of
5 targeted economic incentives, I believe that Colorado should instead re-
6 evaluate more broadly the entire enterprise zone program.

7
8 House Bill 03-1208 would only have been effective when there is a
9 TABOR surplus, which likely will not occur for at least two years.
10 Therefore, the Legislature can come back and revisit this issue next year
11 without any negative impact to businesses that would have benefited from
12 the bill.

13
14 For these reasons, I have vetoed this bill.
