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Ladies and Gentlemen:

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I am filing with the Secretary of State, House Bill 03-1303, "Concerning crimes involving the unauthorized use of communication devices, and, in connection therewith, making an appropriation." The bill would have expanded definitions and criminal penalties for certain technologies and activities that enable telecommunications crimes. I vetoed this bill as of 10:16 A.M. today. This letter sets forth my reason for doing so.

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Our nation's technological innovation is unparalleled, and Colorado's high technology industry plays a significant role in its alacrity. Computers built today approach obsolescence tomorrow. Rarely do our 20 laws keep pace with the technologies some may seek to regulate. In the event that such regulation is necessary, it is critical that the legislation be clearly defined and drafted to avoid confusion. Unfortunately, H.B. 1303 does not meet that standard of clarity.

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H.B. 1303, like similar bills introduced in twelve other states, was drafted in an effort to criminalize the use of certain new technologies to steal communications and copyrighted items. Neither proponents nor opponents can accurately predict the ramifications of H.B. 1303 as law, and it is likely that the question would be settled through litigation. Although the drafters intended that the bill would only be used to prosecute the new thieves and pirates of the digital age, H.B. 1303 could also stifle legal activity by entities all along the high tech spectrum, from manufacturers of communication parts to sellers of communication services.

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I respectfully urge the legislature to revisit this issue in the next session and to be more careful in drafting a bill that adds protections that are rightfully needed, but does not paint a broad brush stroke where only a tight line is needed.

I vetoed this bill as of 4:07 P.M. today, and 31 32 this letter sets forth my reasons for doing so. 33 34 House Bill 03-1315 makes a fundamental change in the administration of the State's Master Lease Program. By changing the membership of the 35 board of directors of the nonprofit corporation responsible for lease-37 purchase agreements to a group of appointed individuals, the bill 38 unnecessarily insulates an important exercise of State financial decisionmaking authority from accountability. To make matters worse, while the 39 40 bill allows State officials to appoint the new membership of the board, it 41 is highly likely that many of the individuals most qualified for such work 42 would decline to serve because of potential conflicts of interest with the 43 underlying transactions. 44 45 While I understand the reason for this legislation and appreciate the opinions of its sponsors, I believe that the potential consequences of the 47 bill unnecessarily compromise the State's ability to make decisions in its 48 best interest. 49 50 Accordingly, I vetoed House Bill 03-1315. 51 52 Sincerely, 53 (signed) 54 Bill Owens 55

50 51 52 53 54 55 56	I am filing with the Secretary of State, House Bill 03-1294, "Concerning Health Insurance for Employers with Fewer Than Fifty-One Employees." I will neither sign nor veto House Bill 03-1294. Therefore, this bill becomes law at 12:01 A.M. on June 7. This letter sets forth my reasons for letting this bill become law without my signature.	

As you know, one of the biggest challenges for Colorado's small businesses is providing affordable health insurance for their employees. A majority of Colorado's small businesses have been hit with premium increases of at least 20 percent for four consecutive years, leading thousands of employers and their workers to abandon Colorado's health insurance market for small businesses (i.e., the small group market).

Under our current system, small businesses whose workers are healthy have an incentive to leave the small group market for less expensive coverage through other arrangements (e.g., the individual market or by self-funding) that can determine rates by health status. These same groups also have an incentive to return to small group market, which currently does not allow rates to be based on health status, when the health status of one or more of their workers deteriorates. Although businesses cannot be faulted for looking out for their own best economic interest, this "gaming" of the small group market has a detrimental effect for those groups that remain in the small group market.

The intent of House Bill 1294 is to stabilize the small group market by allowing insurance carriers to subject small businesses that move in-andout of the small group market to potential premium rate increases of 35 percent based on the health status of their workers. I support this goal, however I do have concerns about the bill's method.

For some small businesses, the 35 percent rate increase will be in addition to a 10 percent increase that was made allowable under House Bill 03-1164, which I recently signed into law. Thus, some employers with unhealthy workers could be subject to a 45 percent premium increase. Fortunately, this would be limited to one year.

Moreover, another important provision of House Bill 1164 authorizes small businesses to band together and leverage their purchasing power through a bona fide association. The bill creates a pilot project to demonstrate whether these arrangements (i.e., "MEWAs") will be successful. I believe MEWAs could provide an excellent opportunity for certain small employers to purchase more affordable health insurance. I am concerned there will be less incentive for groups to participate in the pilot project if they know they could eventually be subject to a 45 percent rate increase if, for whatever reason, they decide to leave the MEWA to return to the small group market.

Despite my concerns, I believe the purpose of the bill is important, and House Bill 1294 should be given an opportunity to work. I encourage the legislature to join me in monitoring the effect of this legislation, and making future changes to it if necessary in order to make health insurance more affordable for Colorado's small businesses.

Accordingly, I am allowing House Bill 03-1294 to become law without my signature.
