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WHEREAS, The concurrent resolution states that "basic 23 knowledge of the past serves as a civic glue, binding together a diverse people into a single Nation with a common purpose"; and 4 5 WHEREAS, The concurrent resolution further states that "citizens 6 who lack knowledge of United States history will also lack an 7 understanding and appreciation of the democratic principles that define 8 and sustain the Nation as a free people, such as liberty, justice, tolerance, 9 government by the consent of the governed, and equality under the law"; 10 and 11 12 WHEREAS, The concurrent resolution cites a Roper survey for 13 the American Council of Trustees and Alumni finding that 80% of our nation's brightest college seniors would score a D or F on basic civics 14 15 knowledge, so that "the next generation of American leaders and citizens is in danger of losing America's civic memory"; now, therefore, 16 17 Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Sixty-fourth 18 19 General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the Senate concurring 20 herein: 21 22 That we, the members of the Sixty-fourth General Assembly, concur with the Congress of the United States that basic knowledge of United States history is essential to full and informed participation in 25 civic life. 26 27 Be It Further Resolved, That it is the sense of the General 28 Assembly that students at Colorado's public colleges and universities should not graduate without a thorough understanding of the democratic 29 30 principles that define and sustain the Nation as a free people, such as 31 liberty, justice, tolerance, government by consent of the governed, and 32 equality under the law, and it is appropriate that the members of the General Assembly consider these values as they develop higher education 34 policy for the state of Colorado. 35 36 37 LAY OVER OF CALENDAR ITEMS 38 On motion of Representative King, the following items on the Calendar 39 40 were laid over until March 5, retaining place on Calendar: 41 42 Consideration of General Orders--HB03-1225, 1250, 1267, SB03-155, 43 HB03-1219, 1311, 1313.
