16 Decker, May M., Rhodes, Rippy, Smith, Spence, White--  
17 Concerning support for administrative procedures that  
18 would enable increased forest management to help reduce  
19 the risk of catastrophic wildfires.

22 WHEREAS, An April 1999 General Accounting Office report to  
23 the United States House of Representatives entitled "Western National  
24 Forests: A Cohesive Strategy is Needed to Address Catastrophic Wildfire  
25 Threats" cited that the most extensive and serious problem related to the  
26 health of national forests in the interior west is the over accumulation of  
27 vegetation, which has caused an increasing number of large, intense,  
28 uncontrollable, and catastrophically destructive wildfires; and

29

30 WHEREAS, An October 2000 United States Forest Service report,  
31 entitled "Protecting People and Sustaining Resources...", confirmed the  
32 conclusion of the 1999 General Accounting Office's report and further  
33 warned that without increased restoration treatments, wildfire suppression  
34 costs, natural resource losses, private property losses, and environmental  
35 damage are certain to escalate as fuels continue to accumulate and more  
36 acres become high risk; and

37

38 WHEREAS, A June 2002 United States Forest Service report  
39 stated that the agency was "so busy meeting procedural  
40 requirements...that it has trouble fulfilling its historic mission: to sustain  
41 the health, diversity, and productivity of the nation's forests and  
42 grasslands to meet the needs of present and future generations"; and

43

44 WHEREAS, The United States Forest Service's failure to promptly  
45 and efficiently implement forest management projects has contributed to  
46 unnatural wildfire risks and the spread of insect and disease epidemics  
47 across all of the national forests in Colorado; and

48

49 WHEREAS, The citizens of Colorado are concerned about the risk  
50 of catastrophic wildfire and the spread of insects and disease, and are  
51 disturbed by the gridlock in federal decision-making that prevents  
52 professional foresters, wildlife biologists, and other professionals from  
53 doing their jobs; and

54

55 WHEREAS, Decades of fire suppression and passive management  
56 have created overly dense, diseased, and fire-prone forests that are the

1 result of conflicting, contradictory, time consuming, and overly  
2 burdensome federal land management procedures and processes; and  
3

4 WHEREAS, In August 2002, President Bush established the  
5 Healthy Forests Initiative, directing the Department of Agriculture, the  
6 Department of the Interior, and the Council on Environmental Quality to  
7 improve regulatory processes to ensure more timely decisions, greater  
8 efficiency, and better results in reducing the risk of catastrophic wildfires  
9 by restoring forest health; and  
10

11 WHEREAS, The citizens of Colorado would benefit immensely  
12 from an increased level of forest management that would help reduce the  
13 risks of insect and disease epidemics and catastrophic wildfire to all of  
14 the national forests in Colorado; now, therefore,  
15

16 *Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Sixty-fourth*  
17 *General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the Senate concurring*  
18 *herein:*  
19

20 (1) That the General Assembly supports the administrative  
21 procedures proposed as part of the President's Healthy Forests Initiative,  
22 particularly those procedures that would expedite decision-making  
23 pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act and those that  
24 establish standing requirements requiring persons to provide specific  
25 written public comments during the preparation stage of a wildfire  
26 mitigation project in order to file an administrative appeal or lawsuit.  
27 Such changes are necessary to enable the land management agencies to  
28 make scientifically based, environmentally sound decisions on hazardous  
29 fuels reduction projects, while encouraging early and effective  
30 participation in the development of those projects by the interested  
31 public.  
32

33 (2) That the General Assembly applauds the President and his  
34 administration for its leadership in defining a new management strategy  
35 for our public lands and fully endorses the idea that restoring common  
36 sense and balance to federal land management can be done without  
37 sacrificing needed environmental protections and oversight;  
38

39 (3) That the General Assembly renews its support for full  
40 implementation and funding of the National Fire Plan and the Western  
41 Governor's Association's 10-Year Comprehensive Strategy and requests  
42 that Governor Owens and the Colorado Congressional Delegation  
43 actively support these collaborative efforts; and  
44

45 (4) That the General Assembly encourages the Colorado  
46 Congressional Delegation to support legislative measures in the 108th  
47 Congress that would further empower land managers with the statutory  
48 tools needed to expeditiously reduce the risk of large-scale wildfires near  
49 communities, watersheds, and in areas at high risk to disease and insect  
50 infestation, including lands presently infected, and on lands where  
51 catastrophic wildfire poses a threat to wildlife.  
52

53 *Be It Further Resolved, That copies of this Joint Resolution be*  
54 *sent to Colorado's Congressional Delegation.*
