19 regions for the Regional Emergency Medical and Trauma Advisory
20 Councils, and another set of regions for bioterrorism planning defined by

24 overlapping regions requires public health and safety managers to
25 participate in redundant planning efforts, reduces the effectiveness of
26 emergency planning and response, creates a risk of incompatible or

29 WHEREAS, A single regional planning and operations map should
30 be created for use by all state and local entities involved in public health
31 and safety; and

33 WHEREAS, Rationalizing the system of regional planning in
34 accordance with the "all risks" approach to public health and safety

36 together to provide integrated and cooperative emergency services to the
37 citizens of Colorado; and
