(D) On and after July 1, 2006, the fee for the issuance of a driver's license to a person sixty-one years of age or older shall be fifteen dollars, which license shall expire on the birthday of the applicant in the fifth year after the issuance thereof. In the case of such a driver's license issued by the office of the county clerk and recorder in each county, the office of the county clerk and recorder shall retain the sum of six dollars, and nine dollars shall be forwarded to the department for transmission to the state treasurer, who shall credit the same to the highway users tax fund, and the general assembly shall make appropriations therefrom for the expenses of the administration of parts 1 and 2 of this article; except that eight dollars and fifty cents of each fee shall be allocated pursuant to section 43-4-205 (6) (b), C.R.S.".

"SECTION 3. Effective date - applicability. This act shall take effect July 1, 2004, and shall apply to driver's license renewals occurring on or after said date.".

House Journal--16th Day--January 23, 2003 WHEREAS, Pursuant to section 24-33-111 (2), Colorado Revised Statutes, the Species Conservation Trust Fund has been created in the state treasury to fund programs designed to conserve native species that have been listed as threatened or endangered under state or federal law, or are candidate species or are likely to become candidate species as determined by the United States Fish and Wildlife Service; and WHEREAS, Pursuant to section 24-33-111 (3), Colorado Revised Statutes, the Executive Director of the Department of Natural Resources, after consulting with the Colorado Water Conservation Board and its Director, the Wildlife Commission, and the Director of the Division of Wildlife, has prepared and delivered to the General Assembly a species conservation eligibility list describing programs and associated costs that are eligible to receive funding from the Species Conservation Trust Fund; and WHEREAS, Pursuant to section 24-33-111 (3), Colorado Revised Statutes, prior to obligating funds from the Species Conservation Trust Fund, the Species Conservation Eligibility List is subject to modification and adoption through the passage of a joint resolution approved by a majority vote of both houses of the General Assembly; and in the interest of the people of the state; now, therefore,

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WHEREAS, The General Assembly deems the recommended expenditures described in the Species Conservation Eligibility List to be

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Sixty-fourth General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the Senate concurring herein:

(1) That the Executive Director of the Department of Natural Resources is authorized to obligate and expend three million six hundred twenty-eight thousand three hundred ninety-five dollars (\$3,628,395) from the capital account of the Species Conservation Trust Fund for the following activities, programs, and species in the following amounts:
