The Friday, March 28 deadline (the 80th legislative day) for passage of the Long Appropriation Bill in the Senate as extended until Monday, April 7, 2003 (the 90th legislative day) is further extended until Wednesday, April 9, 2003 (the 92nd legislative day).

The Friday, April 4 deadline (the 87th legislative day) for passage of the Long Appropriation Bill in the House as extended until Monday, April 14, 2003 (the 97th legislative day) is further extended until Wednesday, April 16, 2003 (the 99th legislative day).

The Friday, April 11 deadline (the 94th legislative day) for adoption of the conference committee report on the Long Appropriation Bill as extended until Friday, April 18, 2003 (the 101st legislative day) is further extended until Monday, April 21, 2003 (the 104th legislative day).
