INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTION 1 2 3 4 The following resolution was read by title and laid over one day under the rules: 5 6 HR03-1009 by Representative(s) Marshall, Spradley, King, Veiga, 7 Romanoff, Madden, Tochtrop, Groff, Coleman, Frangas, 8 Garcia, Larson, Mitchell, Paccione, Salazar, Sanchez--9 Concerning the commemoration of the birthday of the 10 Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. 11 12 WHEREAS, The Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., was born 13 in Atlanta, Georgia, in 1929; and 14 WHEREAS, Rev. Dr. King graduated from Morehouse College 15 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1948, graduated from Crozer 16 17 Theological Seminary in 1951, and received a Ph.D. from Boston 18 University in 1955; and 19 20 WHEREAS, The son of the pastor of the Ebenezer Baptist Church 21 in Atlanta, Rev. Dr. King was ordained in 1947 and became minister of 22 a Baptist church in Montgomery, Alabama, in 1954; and 23 24 WHEREAS, Rev. Dr. King led the boycott by Montgomery 25 African Americans against the segregated city bus lines in 1955-56, the 26 action that many historians consider to be the beginning of the Civil 27 Rights Movement in America; and 28 29 WHEREAS, Rev. Dr. King attained national prominence by 30 advocating a policy of nonviolent resistance to segregation; and 31 32 WHEREAS, In 1956, Rev. Dr. King won a major victory and 33 prestige as a civil rights leader when the Montgomery buses began to 34 operate on a desegregated basis; and 35 36 WHEREAS, After the Montgomery success, Rev. Dr. King 37 organized the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, which gave him 38 a base to pursue further civil rights activities, first in the South and later 39 nationwide; and 40 41 WHEREAS, Rev. Dr. King was arrested on numerous occasions 42 in the 1950s and 1960s while peacefully protesting injustices; and 43 WHEREAS, Rev. Dr. King's civil disobedience attracted 44 45 worldwide attention to the plight of African Americans in the United 46 States; and 47 48 WHEREAS, In 1963, Rev. Dr. King penned "Letter from 49 Birmingham Jail", which remains a timeless exposition of the virtues of 50 nonviolence and civil disobedience; and 51 52 WHEREAS, Rev. Dr. King organized the massive March on 53 Washington, which took place on August 28, 1963, and which brought 54 more than 200,000 people together in the name of equality and civil 55 rights; and 56

WHEREAS, Rev. Dr. King's efforts were instrumental in the 1 enactment of the "Civil Rights Act of 1964", which prohibited 2 3 segregation in public accommodations and facilities and banned 4 discrimination based on race, color, or national origin; and 5 6 WHEREAS, Rev. Dr. King's efforts were instrumental in the 7 enactment of the "Voting Rights Act of 1965", which was landmark 8 legislation to protect the voting rights of minorities in America; and 9 10 WHEREAS, In 1964, Rev. Dr. King was awarded the Nobel Peace 11 Prize for his tireless and selfless work in the pursuit of justice for people 12 of color in America; and 13 14 WHEREAS, On April 4, 1968, Rev. Dr. King was shot and killed 15 by James Earl Ray while standing on the balcony of a motel in Memphis, Tennessee; and 16 17 WHEREAS, Rev.
