FIRST REPORT OF FIRST CONFERENCE COMMITTEE ON SB03-300

THIS REPORT AMENDS THE REREVISED BILL

To the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives:

Your first conference committee appointed on SB03-300, concerning the imposition of a management fee on certain funds that are invested by the state treasurer, has met and reports that it has agreed upon the following:

1. That the Senate accede to the House amendments made to the bill, as said amendments appear in the rerevised bill, with the following changes:

Amend rerevised bill, page 3, line 27, strike "2004." and substitute "2006.".

2. That, under the authority granted the committee to consider matters not at issue between the two houses, the following amendment be recommended:

Amend rerevised bill, page 2, after line 1, insert the following:

"**SECTION 1.** 24-36-102 (1), Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

24-36-102. Function of department - employees. (1) The principal function of the treasury department is to receive all state moneys collected by or otherwise coming into the hands of any officer, department, institution, or agency of the state government as required in section 24-36-103 (1) and to deposit and disburse the same in the manner prescribed by law. It shall have no tax collection or enforcement functions whatsoever. In order to perform the principal function of the treasury department, the state treasurer may contract for services in order to comply with statutory mandates and to ensure that the state receives all revenue accruing to it pursuant to such mandates. Fees for such services shall be continuously appropriated from revenues received through such services and shall not be appropriated from the general fund.".
