"SECTION 2. 38-30.5-103, Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SUBSECTION to read:

38-30.5-103. Nature of conservation easements in gross. (5) A CONSERVATION EASEMENT IN GROSS THAT ENCUMBERS WATER OR A WATER RIGHT AS PERMITTED BY SECTION 38-30.5-104 (1) MAY BE CREATED ONLY BY THE VOLUNTARY ACT OF THE OWNER OF THE WATER OR WATER RIGHT AND MAY BE MADE REVOCABLE BY THE INSTRUMENT CREATING IT.".

Renumber succeeding sections accordingly.

Page 3, line 2, strike "THE WATER RIGHT MAY BE ENCUMBERED";

line 3, strike "BY A CONSERVATION EASEMENT IN GROSS" and substitute "A CONSERVATION EASEMENT IN GROSS THAT ENCUMBERS THE WATER RIGHT MAY BE CREATED OR REVOKED";

line 13, after "lands", insert "OR WATER".

Amend engrossed joint resolution, page 1, strike lines 9 through 11 and substitute the following:

"WHEREAS, 7.5 million acre-feet of water are available annually to the Upper Basin states, as defined in such compact, and Colorado is entitled to 3,855,375 acre-feet annually, of which a significant amount has not yet been developed; and".

Page 2, line 7, strike "over-appropriation" and substitute "over-use";

line 8, strike "forego use" and substitute "forego recent over-use";

line 18, strike "identify, claim, and put";

line 19, strike "to beneficial use" and substitute "quantify, protect, and support the State of Colorado's rights to Colorado River water resources under the Colorado River Compacts of 1922 and 1948, which allow water users in Colorado to place to beneficial consumptive use".

Amend reengrossed bill, page 4, after line 20, insert the following:

HB03-1100

"SECTION 7. 25-1-107 (1), Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW PARAGRAPH to read:

25-1-107. Powers and duties of the department - repeal. (1) The department has, in addition to all other powers and duties imposed upon it by law, the following powers and duties:

(11) TO COORDINATE WITH THE UNITED STATES SECRETARY OF THE INTERIOR AND THE UNITED STATES SECRETARY OF AGRICULTURE TO DEVELOP AIR QUALITY MANAGEMENT PLANS CONSISTENT WITH THIS ARTICLE FOR FEDERAL LANDS PURSUANT TO 16U.S.C. SEC. 530, 16U.S.C. SEC. 1604, AND 43 U.S.C. SEC. 1712.".

Renumber succeeding sections accordingly.

Education After consideration on the merits, the Committee recommends that HB03-1175 be amended as follows, and as so amended, be referred to the Committee of the Whole with favorable recommendation.

> Amend reengrossed bill, page 2, strike lines 11 through 26 and substitute the following:

> ON AND AFTER JULY 1, 2004, A POSTSECONDARY "(3) (a) INSTITUTION IN COLORADO SHALL NOT USE A STUDENT'S SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER OR PART OF A STUDENT'S SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER AS THE STUDENT'S PRIMARY IDENTIFIER.

> (b) NOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISIONS OF PARAGRAPH (a) OF THIS SUBSECTION (3), THE COLORADO COMMISSION ON HIGHER EDUCATION MAY ALLOW A POSTSECONDARY INSTITUTION IN COLORADO TO USE A STUDENT'S SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER OR PART OF A STUDENT'S SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER AS THE STUDENT'S PRIMARY IDENTIFIER IF:

> (I) THE INSTITUTION DEMONSTRATES TO THE SATISFACTION OF THE COMMISSION THAT THE INSTITUTION IS UNABLE TO COMPLY WITH THE PROVISIONS OF PARAGRAPH (a) OF THIS SUBSECTION (3) BECAUSE OF THE FINANCIAL COST OF COMPLIANCE; AND

> (II) THE INSTITUTION SUBMITS TO THE COMMISSION AND THE COMMISSION APPROVES A PLAN AND TIMETABLE FOR PHASING OUT THE USE OF A STUDENT'S SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER OR PART OF A STUDENT'S SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER AS THE STUDENT'S PRIMARY IDENTIFIER."
