Amendment to Article V of the Colorado Constitution, as new section 51:

Be it Enacted by the People of the State of Colorado:

Except as mandated by federal law, the provision of non-emergency services by the state of Colorado or any city, county or other political subdivision thereof, is restricted to citizens of and aliens lawfully present in the United States of America.

Any resident of the state of Colorado shall have standing to sue the state of Colorado or any county, city, or other political subdivision of the state of Colorado, to enforce this amendment. The courts of record of the state of Colorado shall have jurisdiction to hear cases brought to enforce this amendment. The General Assembly may provide reasonable and appropriate limits on the time and manner of suits brought under this amendment.

The General Assembly shall have power to enforce this amendment by definitions, guidelines and other appropriate legislation.
