"SECTION 1. 22-32-109 (1), Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW PARAGRAPH to read:

- **22-32-109.** Board of education specific duties. (1) In addition to any other duty required to be performed by law, each board of education shall have and perform the following specific duties:
 - (11) TO ADOPT A POLICY ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1, 2008, THAT:
- (I) (A) MAKES AVAILABLE AN ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION PROJECT, AT NO EXTRA COST TO THE DISTRICT OR SCHOOL, FOR A STUDENT ENROLLED IN A REQUIRED CLASS INVOLVING THE DISSECTION, VIVISECTION, INCUBATION, OR CAPTURE OF AN ANIMAL.
- (B) THE ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION PROJECT SHALL PROVIDE AN 30 ALTERNATIVE METHOD TO DISSECTION, VIVISECTION, INCUBATION, OR CAPTURE BUT STILL YIELD THE FACTUAL KNOWLEDGE, INFORMATION, OR EXPERIENCE REQUIRED BY THE COURSE OF STUDY, AND MEETS THE STATE'S 33 MODEL CONTENT STANDARDS, ADOPTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 22-7-406.
- (C) THE POLICY SHALL NOT REQUIRE A SCHOOL TO MAKE ANY 36 MODIFICATIONS TO EXISTING CURRICULUM BEYOND OFFERING AN ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION PROJECT TO A STUDENT WHO DECLINES TO PARTICIPATE IN A REQUIRED EDUCATION PROJECT INVOLVING DISSECTION, VIVISECTION, INCUBATION, OR CAPTURE OF AN ANIMAL.
 - (II) Provides notice of the alternative education project POLICY TO STUDENTS ENROLLED IN A REQUIRED CLASS INVOLVING THE DISSECTION, VIVISECTION, INCUBATION, OR CAPTURE OF AN ANIMAL. THE REQUIREMENT OF THIS SUBPARAGRAPH (II) MAY BE SATISFIED THROUGH A WRITTEN NOTICE IN THE COURSE SYLLABUS.
- (III) PROHIBITS THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR A SCHOOL IN THE SCHOOL 48 DISTRICT FROM DISCRIMINATING AGAINST A STUDENT BASED ON HIS OR HER DECISION TO SELECT AN ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION PROJECT IN A REQUIRED CLASS INVOLVING THE DISSECTION, VIVISECTION, INCUBATION, OR CAPTURE OF AN ANIMAL.
 - **SECTION 2. Effective date.** This act shall take effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly that is allowed for submitting a referendum petition pursuant to article V, section 1 (3) of the state

constitution, (August 6, 2008, if adjournment sine die is on May 7, 2008); except that, if a referendum petition is filed against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part, if approved by the people, shall take effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by proclamation of the governor.".".


